TEMPORARY VISITING PROFESSOR LICENSE

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Med 11.01 Requirements. Applicants must be graduates of foreign medical schools outside of the United States and Canada who are distinguished in their specialty and must submit the following:

- (1) Letters of recommendations from universities, institutions, research facilities, etc. to indicate noteworthy professional attainment.
- (2) Notarized photograph of applicant.
- (3) Completed temporary license application.
- (4) Biographical background information on applicant's education and qualifications.

Med 11.02 Recommendations required by medical school in this state. A letter requesting his services must be submitted to this office from one of the medical schools in this state indicating that he has been invited to serve on the academic staff of that medical school as a visiting professor.

Med 11.03 Fee. A fee of \$25 shall be charged for the temporary license.

Med 11.04 Expiration. The temporary license shall expire 2 years after its date of issuance and remain in force only while the holder is serving full time on the academic staff of a medical school.

Med 11.05 Revocation. A violation of any provision of this temporary visiting professor license code or sections 448.18 or 448.19, Wis. Stats., of the medical practice act, shall constitute cause for revocation of such temporary license.

Med 11.06 Renewals. For cause shown to the satisfaction of the medical examining board, the temporary license may be renewed not more than twice at the discretion of the examining board. Renewal fee is \$25.

Med 11.07 Practice limitations. The holder of such a temporary license may engage in the regular practice of medicine and surgery providing such practice is confined to the medical school in which he is serving full time on the academic staff.
