ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

IN THE MATTER OF amending Chapter NR 10.01 (4) (c) and (d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code

G-21-73

Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by Sections 29.085 and 29.174, Wisconsin Statutes, the Natural Resources Board hereby amends rules as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 10.01 (4) (c) and (d) is amended to read:

(c) BEAVER. It is unlawful for any person to take in any zone more than the season bag limit established for such zone, and it is unlawful for any person to take more than a total combined season bag limit of 50 beaver in all the open season zones in the state.

⁽d) OTTER. The opening date for the trapping season for otter shall be concurrent with the opening date for trapping beaver in all zones established under paragraph (c) of this section. The open season for trapping otter in all zones shall extend

through the last day of the beaver season specified for Zone B. The season bag limit is two otter in Zone A and one otter in Zone B and Zone C. Each person who has trapped an otter will affix to such carcass immediately upon trapping a tag issued by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. Upon request such tags will be issued free of charge by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Box 450, Madison, Wisconsin 53701

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on October 18, 1973.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on December 1, 1973.
