

ORDER OF THE
STATE ELECTIONS BOARD
REPEALING AND ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Elections Board by section 227.014, Wis. Stats., the State Elections Board hereby repeals and adopts rules as follows:

Sections ElBd. 1.02 (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5); 1.03 (1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6); 1.04 (1), (2), (3) and (4); 1.05; 1.105; 1.11 (1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6); 1.14; 1.20; 2.10 (1), (2), (3) and (4); 2.12 (1) and (2); 5.05; 5.06; 6.05 (1), (2) and (3); and 8.03 (1) and (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are repealed.

Sections ElBd. 1.12 (1), (2) and (3); and 8.03 (1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are adopted to read:

1.12 FILING REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIAL ELECTIONS. (1) Every political committee and every political group required to register under sec. 11.05, Wis. Stats., and formed exclusively to affect the outcome of a special election shall file election reports on the dates specified in sec. 11.20 (3), Stats.

(2) Every political party committee and every political committee and group not specified in (1) that makes a direct disbursement to affect the outcome of a special election shall file election reports on the dates specified in sec. 11.20 (3), Stats.

(3) A direct disbursement under (2) shall not include a contribution made to a political party committee, a political committee or a political group.

(3) Special Report of Late Contribution.

(4) Political Party Committee Report of Contributions.



The rules and repeals contained herein shall take effect on the first day of the month following their publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as prescribed in sec. 227.026 (1), Wis. Stats.

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING
ELECTION CAMPAIGN REGISTRATION STATEMENT
FORM EB-1**

GENERAL: An ELECTION CAMPAIGN REGISTRATION STATEMENT must be completed and filed by every political party committee, every other political committee (other than a personal campaign committee), every political group, and every individual (other than a candidate) which/who makes or accepts contributions, incurs obligations or makes disbursements in a calendar year in an aggregate amount in excess of \$25, and by every candidate and personal campaign committee regardless of the amount of contributions, obligations or disbursements expected. This provision does not apply to individuals who make contributions to registered committees.

DEFINITIONS: **CANDIDATE** – every person for whom it is contemplated or desired that votes be cast at any election, whether or not such person is elected or nominated, and who tacitly or expressly consents to be so considered.

CONTINUING COMMITTEE – any group or committee which intends to remain in operation after an election.

FILING OFFICER – the agency or person responsible for distributing registration and reporting materials and receiving completed statements and reports from each person, committee or group. The State Elections Board is the Filing Officer for candidates and committees associated with state office and statewide referenda. The local clerk is the Filing Officer for candidates and committees associated with local office and local referenda.

PERSONAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE – a committee which is under the direct control of the candidate formed for the exclusive purpose of electing or re-electing a candidate for office.

POLITICAL COMMITTEE – any person or combination of two or more persons, permanent or temporary, which makes or accepts contributions or makes disbursements for political purposes other than a political party committee or political group.

POLITICAL GROUP – any person or combination of two or more persons, permanent or temporary, which makes or accepts contributions or makes disbursements to influence the outcome of a referendum.

POLITICAL PARTY COMMITTEE – a state committee organized exclusively for political purposes, recognized by the national organization of the party (if any), and all county, congressional, legislative, local and other affiliated committees authorized to operate under the same name.

REGISTRANT – any person, committee or group required to register under campaign finance laws as identified in the **GENERAL** part of these instructions.

VOLUNTARY COMMITTEE – any committee or individual acting in support of or in opposition to any candidate or combination of candidates without the encouragement of a candidate and over which a candidate has no control or direction.

ITEM 1: Enter full name and mailing address of organization (e.g., Friends of John Smith for Assembly, Democratic Committee of Sleepwell County, Charlie Boxer for Dogcatcher) (to be completed by all registrants).

Enter information requested in either Item 1.A *or* Item 1.B *or* Item 1.C depending on whether registrant is a candidate, committee or group as defined (only one of the three items should be completed by a registrant).

ITEM 2: Enter full name, mailing address and telephone number of committee treasurer (each registrant is required by law to appoint one campaign treasurer who could be the candidate himself or herself).

ITEM 3: Enter information regarding the area and jurisdiction in which the registrant will operate (e.g., candidate for county office would check **SINGLE COUNTY** box and enter county name).

ITEM 4: Specify if committee should be classified as a continuing committee (i.e., one that intends to remain in existence beyond the election specified in Items 1.A and 1.B).

- ITEM 5: Enter information regarding affiliation with another organization (generally a parent organization, such as, the State Republican Party, the AFL-CIO, the Wisconsin Education Association, etc.).
- ITEM 6: Enter information regarding reports which registrant is required to file with national filing officers (e.g., Federal Election Commission reports if registrant is also supporting or opposing a federal candidate).
- ITEM 7: Enter full name, address and account number of campaign depository, and any other investment account or safety deposit boxes where campaign funds are kept (each registrant is required by law to designate a single campaign depository within 5 days after receiving first contribution and before making any disbursement).
- ITEM 8: Enter full name, mailing address and position of principal officers and custodians of books and accounts other than candidate or treasurer, if any, (e.g., Campaign Chairman, District Campaign Director, Finance Committee members, Assistant Treasurer, etc.).
- ITEM 9: List sources of income to be collected or raised for political purposes (e.g., contributions and sales).
- ITEM 10: Identify the purposes for which disbursements will be made by the registrant (e.g., political activity).
- ITEM 11: Indicate how remaining funds will be disposed of at such time that political activities cease and the organization terminates.
- ITEM 12: To be used *only* by those registrants who do not anticipate contributions, disbursements or obligations to exceed \$250 in the aggregate *in any calendar year* (enter full name of candidate or treasurer in space provided).
- ITEM 13: Enter information requested, sign affidavit in presence of notary public, and have notary public complete balance of affidavit (use of notary seal is *not* a requirement).

NOTE: Detailed information regarding campaign finance laws and procedures are contained in the document entitled "Campaign Finance Manual" available at no charge from local filing officers and the State Elections Board.

The Filing Officer must be notified of any change to this statement within 10 days following the change (the same day if Item 12 is completed). Such notice must be made in written form and be properly notarized.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING ELECTION CAMPAIGN FINANCIAL REPORT FORM EB-2

GENERAL: An ELECTION CAMPAIGN FINANCIAL REPORT must be completed and filed before and after primaries and elections by all registrants and in January and July by committees that remain in existence after the election year. Failure to file financial reports by the required deadlines is a violation of the law and will subject the violator to a forfeiture or fine. Registrants exempted from filing reports at the time of registration need not file financial reports unless their status changes as provided in the affidavit of registration.

PAGE 1: Enter full name of organization as listed on Election Campaign Registration Statement and enter address where reporting forms and notices are normally sent. Check box if there is an address change.

Indicate which report period applies to report being submitted (along with date of termination or suspension if applicable) and date of primary or election covered by report. Each report is required to disclose all receipts and expenditures from the last date of the previous report (referred to as closing date) through the closing date of the report for the current period.

The closing date and deadline for filing each report is as follows:

Pre-primary	15 days before primary	8 days before primary
Post-primary	20 days after primary	30 days after primary
Pre-election	15 days before election	8 days before election
Post-election	20 days after election	30 days after election

If reports are mailed they must be postmarked no later than the deadline for filing. The burden of proof is on the registrant to show that the report was mailed on time.

The information for the summary report is transferred from the Schedules on pages 2, 3 and 4 as indicated. Calendar year to date figures are obtained by adding the figures for the current reporting period to those in your last report for calendar year to date.

The purpose of the summary report is to show what your committee has received and spent during the reporting period and for the calendar year through the date of the report. It also helps you determine how close you are to reaching your expenditure limitation.

If there is no activity for the reporting period, fill in the figures for calendar year to date (Column B) that appeared in the last report you filed. If you have no activity to report for the calendar year to date for any Section, mark the NONE box. This lets the Filing Officer know that you have not forgotten to complete that Section.

Sections E and F must be completed only when items have been reported in Schedule 5 that will affect net receipts or you wish to reduce disbursements charged against the expenditure limitation.

Be sure to complete Section G, CASH BALANCE. NOTE: Since in-kind contributions are balanced by in-kind disbursements, the cash balance is not affected by inclusion of these items in Sections A and B. This figure should agree with your checkbook balance plus any investments and any reported but undeposited contributions as of the closing date.

Enter full name in verification space, sign and have notarized in space provided. The notary seal is not required.

SCHEDULE 1: 1.A.—Contributions to be reported in this section include loans from individuals, purchases of tickets for fund-raising events, and in-kind contributions as well as cash contributions. See the Campaign Finance Manual for a more detailed explanation of how a contribution on a sales item is figured.

Note that any contribution of \$20 or less during the current reporting period must be itemized if when added to previous contributions from the donor the total exceeds \$20 for the calendar year to date. You must fill in the cumulative total for the calendar year for each contributor who is listed in this schedule. Be sure to include occupation and principal place of employment for any contributor of over \$100 cumulatively for the calendar year.

1.B.—This is the total of unitemized contributions (\$20 or less) for the reporting period.

Add 1.A. and 1.B. totals and enter the sum of Column A on line 1, Column A, Section A, of the Summary Report.

1.C.—Transfers In are all contributions received *from* any committee that has filed a registration statement with a filing officer. Enter total of Transfers In on line 2, Column A, Section A, Summary Report.

1.D.—Itemize any receipts over \$20 not included in 1.A., 1.C. or 1.F. (Include here the difference between the amount on a sale that has been reported as a contribution in 1.A. and the sales price).

1.E.—This is the total of all miscellaneous income of \$20 or less.

Enter the total of 1.D. and 1.E. on line 4, Column A, Section A of the Summary Report.

1.F.—Itemize all loans of \$20 or over from commercial sources, or check *NONE* box if that is applicable.

1.G.—This is the total of any unitemized loans of \$20 or less received during the reporting period.

Add 1.F. and 1.G. totals and enter the sum on line 5, Column A, Section A, Summary Report.

SCHEDULE 2: 2.A.—Itemize all payments over \$20 to persons and businesses during this report period. This means that every payment made from the campaign depository account during the report period will be listed in either 2.A. or 2.B. of this schedule.

Be sure to report all in-kind disbursements. Since every in-kind contribution is for goods or services that would otherwise have to be paid for, all in-kind contributions listed in Schedule 1 should be reported in Schedule 2 as disbursements.

Costs of fund-raising events must be listed in this schedule and then repeated in Schedule 4 if you want to have them excluded from the expenditure limitation.

Be sure to check whether the payment is for use in the primary or election, as the law sets limits on the total amount of allowable expenditures for each. If this report covers activity outside the campaign period as defined in sec. 11.31 (7) of the statutes, do not check unless sec. 11.31 (7) (b) applies.

2.B.—This is the total of unitemized disbursements of \$20 or less for the reporting period.

Add totals in 2.A. and 2.B. and enter the sum on line 1, Column A, Section B, Summary Report.

2.C.—Transfers to other registrants are all contributions or payments made to another registered committee. Enter total on line 2, Column A, Section B, Summary Report.

SCHEDULE 3: 3.A.—Itemize all contributions over \$20 which were not deposited in the campaign depository before they were returned to the donor. These returned contributions have no effect on the cash balance and are therefore treated in a separate category.

3.B.—This is the total of unitemized returned contributions of \$20 or less which were not deposited in the campaign depository before they were returned to the donor.

Add totals of 3.A. and 3.B. and enter on line 1, Column A, Section C, Summary Report.

SCHEDULE 4: 4.A.—Itemize all unpaid bills and loans, and contracts that are over \$20. Payments on incurred obligations are to be reported in Schedule 2.

4.B.—This is the total of unitemized incurred obligations of \$20 or less.

Add totals of 4.A. and 4.B. and enter the sum on line 4, Column B, Section D, Summary Report.

SCHEDULE 5: This schedule lists items (negative entries) that can be subtracted from the cumulative receipt and expenditure totals to produce net receipts and net expenditures.

5.A.—List the amount repaid on loan *principal*. These loan repayments are subtracted because the money which the loan supplied was used to pay for expenditures listed in Schedule 2 that are charged against the limitation, and you do not want to count the same dollars twice. The repayments are also subtracted from receipts because when the loan is repaid the receipts should be reduced by that amount.

5.B.—List here contributions that had been deposited in the campaign depository and then returned to the donor or donated (other than for termination). These are checks written on the campaign depository but not properly chargeable against the expenditure limitation. Since the contribution has been returned it should also be subtracted from the receipts.

5.C.—List here the refunds and rebates previously listed in Schedule 1.D. and 1.E.

The items in Schedules 5.A., 5.B. and 5.C. apply to both receipts and expenditures. Enter the sub-total on line 2, Column B, Section E, Summary Report. The result tells you what your net receipts are from calendar year to date.

5.D.—These are exclusions listed by law of expenditures that are not charged against the expenditure limitation. They include federal, state and local taxes paid, and the following costs for fund-raising events: facilities rental, entertainment expense, food and beverages (including the preparation and service thereof if contracted to an outside agency) if utilized for a meal, sale, rally or similar fund-raising effort or program which is intended for political purposes; and any recount expenses paid from the campaign depository.

The items in Schedule 5.D. are added to the subtotal of Schedules 5.A., 5.B. and 5.C. because these items apply only to expenditures. Enter this total on line 2, Column B, Section F, Summary Report. The result tells you what your net expenditures are that are chargeable against your expenditure limitation from calendar year to date.

SCHEDULE 6: If you are terminating the activities of the committee with this report, indicate in this schedule the disposal of funds that remain in the campaign depository account. By law, you may either donate the funds to a charitable organization, to the common school fund, contribute them to other political registrants or return them to contributors.

SCHEDULE 7: The suspension affidavit may not be used until after the election for which you are reporting. Read the affidavit carefully to make sure that you are meeting all of the requirements for suspension.

NOTE: You are required to file a certified duplicate copy of this report with the appropriate County Clerk (Board of Election Commissioner in Milwaukee County) if you are a candidate for the Legislature or Circuit Court and your district is wholly contained in one county, or if you are registered as a voluntary committee or individual acting in support of or in opposition to such a single-county candidate.

Whoever intentionally does any of the following violates Section 12.13 (1) Wisconsin Statutes:

- (a) Votes at any election or meeting if he does not have the necessary elector qualifications and residence requirements.
- (b) Falsely procures registration or makes false statements to the board of registry or inspector of elections whether or not under oath.
- (c) Registers as an elector in more than one place for the same election.
- (d) Impersonates a registered elector or poses as another person for the purpose of voting at an election.
- (e) Votes more than once in the same election.
- (f) Shows his marked ballot to any person or places a mark upon the ballot so it is identifiable as his ballot.
- (g) Procures an official ballot and neglects or refuses to cast or return it. This paragraph does not apply to persons who have applied for and received absentee ballots.
- (h) Procures, assists or advises someone to do any of the acts prohibited by this subsection.

Section 12.60 (1) Wisconsin Statutes states that whoever violates s. 12.13 (1) may be fined not more than \$10,000, or imprisoned not more than 3 years in the state prison, or both.
