IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING AN EMERGENCY * RULE RELATING TO PHYSICAL STANDARDS * FOR SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS *

ORDER ADOPTING EMERGENCY RULE UNDER 227.02(1)(c), and 227.027, WIS. STATS., WITHOUT NOTICE AND PUBLIC HEARING

Pursuant to authority vested in the Division of Motor Vehicles of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation under 110.06, Wis. Stats., the division finds that an emergency exists and that the emergency rule included below is for the immediate preservation of the public welfare.

A statement of the facts constituting the emergency is as follows: Chapter MVD 17 sets forth driver physical requirements for school bus drivers. Chapter PI 7, Pupil Transportation - Physical Requirements, also sets forth physical requirements for school bus drivers. Chapter MVD 17 is not in agreement with Chapter PI 7. Section 343.12 (2)(g), Wis. Stats., provides authority for the department of public instruction to establish physical standards and therefore, that portion of Chapter MVD 17 relating to physical standards, is repealed.

The amendment is therefore adopted as an emergency rule to take effect upon publication and filing with the Secretary of State and the Revisor of Statutes as provided in section 227.027, Wis. Stats.

MVD 17.10 (2) is repealed and recreated to read:

MVD 17.10 (2) Physical qualifications. No person may be issued a school bus operator's license unless the person meets the physical standards established by the department of public instruction.
