

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

REPEALING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 29.107, 29.174 and 227.014, Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby repeals, amends, repeals and recreates, and creates rules as follows:

SECTION 1 - Section NR 10.01 (3) (e) 1. is amended to read:

1. ZONE "A"

In all portions of the state not otherwise listed in the following described season zones, "B" through "H".

Kind of animal and locality	Open season (both dates inclusive)	Bag limit
Shotgun season	Beginning on the Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 9 consecutive days	One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length
b. All other parts of Zone "A"

SECTION 2 - Section NR 10.01 (3) (e) 2. is amended to read:

2. ZONE "B"

The counties or parts of counties of Buffalo, (south of U.S. highway 10), Crawford, Jackson (south of state highways 54, 71 and 108), La Crosse, Monroe (south of state highway 71 and west of state highway 27), Pepin (south of U.S. highway 10), Pierce (south of U.S. highway 10), Trempealeau (west and south of state highways 93 and 121, U.S. highways 10 and 53 and state highway 54), Vernon (west of U.S. highway 61 and state highway 27).

- a. In Vernon county west and north of state highway 27 and state highway 82

SECTION 5 - Section NR 10.01 (3) (e) 8. is repealed and recreated to read:

8. ZONE "H"

In the part of Adams county (south of state highway 23), Columbia county (north of the north bank of the Wisconsin river, south of state highway 23 and west of U.S. highway 51) and Marquette county (south of state highway 23 and west of U.S. highway 51).

Firearm season	Beginning on the Saturday immediately preceding the Thanksgiving holiday and continuing for 3 consecutive days	One deer per season, either sex
	Beginning on the day immediately after the season described above and continuing for 6 consecutive days	One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length

SECTION 6 - Section NR 10.01 (3) (e) 9. is created to read:

9. Deer quotas for 1977 deer season. The department will issue party permits in sufficient numbers to assure the harvest of the number of deer for each quota area indicated in the following table. Quota areas are composed of single management units or parts of units, the boundaries of which are established in Wis. Adm. Code section NR 10.24. The number of party permits to be issued to harvest the indicated number of deer is determined by an average of the hunter success rates from the most recent 3 previous seasons with party permits in each quota area or by an average of fewer seasons where a 3-year average is not available. In establishing a quota for an area without a prior history of party permits, the average success rates of adjacent quota areas are applied. Party permit success rates used to compute the number of permits to be issued for each management unit are those published by the department in annual deer season reports.

SECTION 7 - Section NR 10.01 (4) (c) is amended to read:

(c) Beaver. It is unlawful for any person to take in any zone more than the season bag limit established for such zone and it is unlawful for any person to take more than a total combined season bag limit of 50 beaver in all the open season zones in the state.

2. ZONE B

All other parts of the state except there shall be no open season in Adams county and all that portion of Juneau county lying south and east of a line beginning at the intersection of county highway G and the Castle Rock flowage located in the SENE, section 14, township 16 north, range 4 east, thence southwesterly on said highway G to its intersection with state highway 82, thence westerly on said highway 82 to its intersection with state highway 71, thence westerly on said highway 71 to the county line.

SECTION 8 - Section NR 10.01 (4) (d) is amended to read:

(d) Otter. There is no open season for otter in those counties or portions of counties closed to beaver trapping as established in paragraph (c), and in that part of Buffalo, La Crosse, Trempealeau and Vernon counties lying westerly of state highway 35, that part of Crawford county lying westerly of a line beginning with the junction of state highway 35 and the Vernon county line, thence southerly along said highway 35 to its junction with U.S. highway 18, thence westerly along said highway 18 to its junction with the Burlington Northern railroad, thence southerly along said railroad to its junction with Grant county line, and that part of Grant county lying westerly of the Burlington Northern railroad. In the rest of the state, the opening date for trapping season for otter shall be concurrent with the opening date for trapping

beaver in all zones established under paragraph (c) of the section. The open season for trapping otter in all zones shall extend through the last day of the beaver season specified for zone "B". The season bag is 2 otter in zone "A" and one otter in zone "B". It is unlawful for any person to take more than a total combined season bag limit of 2 otter in all the open season zones in the state. Each person who has trapped an otter will attach and lock to such carcass immediately upon encountering the animal in his/her trap, a tag issued by the department. Upon request, such tags will be issued free of charge by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, Box 7921, Madison, Wisconsin 53707.

SECTION 9 - Section NR 10.24 (1) is amended to read:

(1) Deer management units are established as designated on the following map entitled "Deer Management Units" (revised 1977). (See map at the end of this chapter.)

SECTION 10 - Section NR 11.17 (1) is repealed.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on June 16, 1977.
