

ORDER OF

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by sections 168.03, 168.04 and 168.07, Wis. Stats. (Chapter 29, Laws of 1977), the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby creates and adopts rules of Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter Ind 10--Petroleum Products.

The rules attached hereto shall become effective December 1, 1977, as provided in chapter 227, Wis. Stats.

Section Ind 10.01 is created to read:

Ind 10.01 PETROLEUM PRODUCT SPECIFICATIONS. All petroleum products designated by name or reference as "No. 2 fuel oil" and "No. 2 diesel fuel" shall meet the following minimum product grade specifications:


- (1) Flash point. The flash point, by means of the Tagliabue closed cup tester, shall be not less than 110° F.
- (2) Volatility. Not less than 90% of the product shall be recovered at 640° F.

Note: Pursuant to section 168.07, Wis. Stats., the department will conduct their inspections in accordance with the methods outlined in the latest revision of the ASTM Book of Standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials.

- (3) Classification. Any petroleum product meeting the specifications outlined above shall, for the purpose of this section, be classified as No. 2 fuel oil or No. 2 diesel fuel.
