



REPEALING RULES

IN THE MATTER of the repeal of section NR 26.13(15)(b), Wisconsin .
Administrative Code pertaining to a fish refuge in Sturgeon Bay, .
Door County, locally known as the .
Baudhuin Yacht Harbor .

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

The area in Sturgeon Bay, Door County, locally known as the Baudhuin Yacht Harbor was established as a fish refuge on January 1, 1977. The refuge was established pursuant to sec. 23.09(2)(c), Stats., upon the finding of the Natural Resources Board that such action was reasonably necessary to secure the perpetuation of chinook salmon and other fish and maintain an adequate supply of those species by providing a safe retreat in which they may breed and replenish adjacent fishing waters. On January 15, 1979, Gerald G. Corectke filed suit in Dane County Circuit Court alleging that the establishment of the refuge was improperly adopted and exceeded the authority of the Department of Natural Resources and Natural Resources Board.

Subsequent to the establishment of the refuge, the Department of Natural Resources has discovered other and additional locations which serve to achieve the results and ends of the aforementioned fish refuge. After an agreement was reached between Mr. Gorectke and the Department of Natural Resources, Circuit Court Judge William Eich issued a Declaratory Judgment on August 1, 1979 declaring that section NR 26.13(15)(b), Wis. Adm. Code, is not necessary to serve the purposes required by sec. 23.09(2)(c), Stats.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 23.09, 227.014 and 227.02(1)(b), Wisconsin Statutes, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby repeals rules as follows:

SECTION 1 - Section NR 26.13 (15) (b) is repealed.

The rules contained herein shall take effect upon publication.
