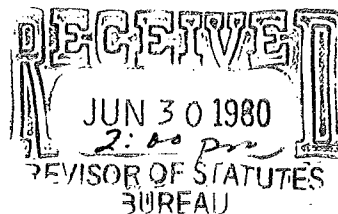

ORDER OF THE EMPLOYE TRUST FUNDS BOARD

REPEALING RULES

Relating to rules concerning requirement of birth evidence by the Wisconsin Retirement Fund.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Employee Trust Funds


The repeal of RET 2.53 and RET 5.13 will remove the requirement that participants or employers in the Wisconsin Retirement Fund submit birth evidence at age 55 or when filing an application for benefits. Currently, the State Teachers Retirement System does not require such evidence, but rather requires evidence only when there is a discrepancy in department records. After repeal of these provisions, the Wisconsin Retirement Fund will be able to adopt similar procedures.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Employee Trust Funds Board by section 41.04 (2) (e), Wis. Stats. and Chapter 280, Laws of 1975, the Employee Trust Funds Board hereby repeals rules as follows:

RET 2.53 is repealed.

RET 5.13 is repealed.

The amendments contained in this order shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026 (1) (intro.) Wis. Stats.

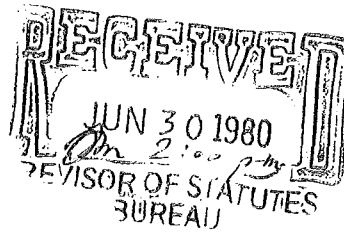
