

ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

1 To amend Ag 10.02(1) and (2) (intro), relating to a require-
2 ment that interstate health certificates for imported bovine
3 animals contain a statement concerning absence of exposure to
4 paratuberculosis.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Agriculture,
Trade and Consumer Protection

The department's change in s. Ag 10.02(1) will require an accredited veterinarian issuing an interstate health certificate to make and execute a statement which declares that no known exposure of the imported animals to paratuberculosis (Johne's disease) has occurred. The effect of this change is to reduce the possibility of paratuberculosis infected or exposed animals from entering Wisconsin.

A further change, which provides more clarity to the rule, reorganizes the current and new provisions of s. Ag 10.02(1) by separating into subparagraphs the requirements for a valid interstate health certificate.

The classification of states by the federal bureau, based upon the incidence of brucellosis in the state and in accord with "Uniform Methods and Rules for Brucellosis Control," has been changed. Therefore, the "brucellosis free" designation in s. Ag 10.02(2) is updated by adding the words "or Class 'A'" for consistency with nomenclature used by other states and USDA.

5 Pursuant to authority vested in the State of Wisconsin
6 Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection by
7 section 93.07(1) and (10), Wis. Stats., the State of Wisconsin
8 Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection amends
9 and adopts rules interpreting sections 93.07(10), 95.18 and 95.19,
10 Wis. Stats., as follows:

11 SECTION 1. Ag 10.02(1) and (2) (intro) are amended to read:

1 Ag 10.02 BOVINE ANIMALS, IMPORT. (1) PERMIT; INTERSTATE
2 HEALTH CERTIFICATE. No person shall import cattle or American
3 bison into this state unless premovement authorization for entry
4 has been granted by the department and the animals are accompanied
5 by an interstate health certificate containing.

6 (a) The interstate health certificate shall contain all of
7 the following:

8 1. the The premovement authorization permit number assigned
9 by the department;.

10 2. individual Individual animal identification code or
11 number;.

12 3. a A record of official brucellosis vaccination; and.

13 4. a A report of negative brucellosis, tuberculosis and
14 anaplasmosis tests conducted within 30 days prior to entry.

15 5. A statement in the following form, signed by the issuing
16 accredited veterinarian:

17 VETERINARIAN'S CERTIFICATE

18 To the best of my knowledge, these animals did not
19 originate in herds in which paratuberculosis (Johne's
20 Disease) has been diagnosed.

22 (b) A copy of each interstate health certificate, approved
23 by the chief livestock health official of the state of origin of
24 the shipment, shall be filed with the department.

25 (c) This section subsection shall not apply to:

26 (a) 1. Steers.

1 (b) 2. Animals shipped directly to a slaughtering estab-
2 lishment under certificates, permits, owner's statements, or other
3 documents as required by the federal bureau for interstate ship-
4 ment of animals for immediate slaughter, except as otherwise
5 provided under subs. (6) and (7).

6 (c) 3. Animals shipped for exhibition only if the animals
7 are accompanied by an interstate health certificate which includes
8 thereon a report of a negative brucellosis, tuberculosis and
9 anaplasmosis test conducted within 90 days of exhibition and the
10 statement required under par. (a)5.

11 (d) 4. Animals shipped to a specifically approved livestock
12 market under certificates, permits, owner's statements, or other
13 documents as required by the federal bureau, except as otherwise
14 provided under subs. (6) and (7).

15 (e) 5. Feeder cattle shipped in conformity with
16 s. Ag 10.03.

17 (f) 6. Animals shipped in conformity with s. Ag 10.08.

18 (g) 7. Animals not known to be affected with or exposed to
19 brucellosis, if shipped directly to an approved quarantine feed
20 ~~lot~~ feedlot accompanied by an interstate health certificate
21 showing individual ear tag identifications and the number of the
22 quarantine feed ~~lot~~ feedlot to which the animals are shipped.

23 (h) 8. Female calves under 6 months of age if accompanied
24 by an interstate health certificate containing individual animal
25 identification code or number.

26 (2) BRUCELOSIS TEST. (intro) The brucellosis test
27 required under this section shall be conducted at a state or fed-

1 erally approved laboratory by the tube or card test method. All
 2 imported cattle originating from states with areas not certified
 3 as brucellosis free or Class "A" by the federal bureau shall be
 4 placed under quarantine by the department and held separate and
 5 apart from all other livestock and retested at owner's expense not
 6 less than 45 days nor more than 120 days after the date of import.
 7 The quarantine will be released if no evidence of brucellosis is
 8 disclosed. The requirement for a negative brucellosis test under
 9 sub. (1) does not apply to:

10 The rules and amendments contained in this order shall take
 11 effect on the first day of the month following publication in the
 12 Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.026(1),
 13 (intro), Stats.
