Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

The creation of s. NR 19.09(2m)(aa) and the amending of ss. NR 19.09(2m)(c), (d),(e),(g),(h) & (k) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code will result in the addition of a total of 19 lakes in Barron, Burnett, Douglas, Forest, Oneida, Polk and Washburn Counties to those lakes subject to a closed season for ricing as designated by the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources pursuant to s. NR 19.09(2), Wis. Adm. Code. These lakes are added as a result of negotiations with the Voigt Inter-Tribal Task Force, clarification of the present rule and a biological need where new wild rice beds have been developed.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by ss. 29.544 and 227.014(2)(a) Stats., the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends and creates rules interpreting s. 29.544, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. NR 19.09 (2m) (aa) is created to read:

NR 19.09(2m)(aa) <u>Barron county</u>. Bear lake, Beaver Dam lake and Red Cedar lake.

SECTION 2. NR 19.09(2m)(c), (d), (e), (g), (h) and (k) are amended to read:

NR 19.09(2m)(c) Burnett county. Bashaw lake, Big Clam lake, Big Sand

lake, Briggs lake, Gaslyn lake, Long lake, Mud lake, town of Oakland, Mud

lake, town of Swiss and , Mud Hen lake, Spencer lake and Trade lake.

(d) <u>Douglas county</u>. In Allouez Bay in the city of Superior <u>and Mulligan</u> lake.

(e) <u>Forest county</u>. <u>Atkins lake</u>, Riley lake, Big Rice lake and Wabigon lake.

(g) <u>Oneida county</u>. <u>Atkins lake, Big lake and Big lake thoroughfare, Gary</u> Gary lake, Little Rice lake, Rice lake and Spur lake.

(h) <u>Polk county</u>. Balsam Branch, <u>Big Round lake</u>, <u>East lake</u>, Glenton lake, Little Butternut lake and, Nye lake, Rice lake and White Ash lake.

(k) <u>Washburn county</u>. <u>Bear lake</u>, Gilmore lake, <u>Little Mud lake</u>, Long lake, Mud lake, Nancy lake, Rice lake, Spring lake and Tranus lake.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on January 23, 1985.

The rules contained herein shall take effect as provided in s. 227.026(1)(intro) Stats.
