ORDER OF THE VETERINARY EXAMINING BOARD REPEALING,

AMENDING OR ADOPTING RULES

AN ORDER to create VE 3.02(27) and 7.03(9), relating to unprofessional conduct.

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Analysis prepared by the department of regulation and licensing.

ANALYSIS

In this order the veterinary examining board creates ss. VE 3.02(27) and 7.03(9) which defines having a license, certificate, permit or registration granted by another state to practice veterinary medicine or as an animal technician limited, suspended or revoked or subject to any other disciplinary action as a standard of unprofessional conduct for veterinarians and animal technicians.

The adoption of the standards which interpret s. 453.07, Stats., relating to denial limitation, suspension, revocation and reprimand, will permit the board to take disciplinary action against a licensee or deny a license to an applicant, if the licensee or applicant violates related standards of practice in another jurisdiction.

ORDER

Pursuant to authority vested in the veterinary examining board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.014(2)(a) and 453.07, Stats., the veterinary examining board hereby creates and adopts rules, interpreting s. 453.07, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. VE 3.02(27) is created to read:

VE 3.02(27) Having a license, certificate, permit or registration granted by another state to practice as a veterinarian limited, suspended or revoked or subject to any other disciplinary action.

SECTION 2. VE 7.03(9) is created to read:

VE 7.03(9) Having a license, certificate, permit or registration granted by another state to practice as an animal technician limited, suspended or revoked or subject to any other disciplinary action.

The rules created and adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.026(1)(intro.), Stats.
