ADOPTING RULES

ORDER

AN ORDER to create Wis. Adm. Code s. 10.02(2)(u) relating to medical malpractice liability insurance for podiatrists.

Analysis prepared by the department of regulation and licensing.

ANALYSIS

1985 Wisconsin Act 340 created Wis. Stats. s. 448.075, which requires that licensed podiatrists must annually submit to the medical examining board evidence of malpractice liability insurance coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$1,000,000 for all occurrences in one year. This order creates s. Med 10.02(2)(u) to define as unprofessional conduct a failure by a podiatrist to submit the required report, and to establish June 30 of each year as the deadline for submitting the report.

TEXT OF RULE

Pursuant to authority vested in the medical examining board in ss. 15.08(5), 227.11(2)(a), 448.03, and 448.40, Stats., the medical examining board hereby creates rules interpreting s. 448.075, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. Med 10.02(2)(u) of the Wisconsin administrative code is created to read:

(u) Failure of a podiatrist to submit to the board on or before June 30 of each year evidence that the podiatrist has in effect malpractice liability insurance coverage in the amount of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$1,000,000 for all occurrences in one year.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This rule shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.22(2), Stats.
