# ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of repealing s. NR 20.03(1)(c)1.; renumbering s. NR 20.03(1)(c)2. to 5. amending ss. NR 19.27(1), 20.03(1)(a)6., 20.03(1)(e)4. and 5., 20.04(3)(c), 20.06(1)(b) (intro.), 20.12(6)(b), 25.07(2)(a)3.b.2) and 25.09(2)(a)10.a.; repealing and recreating ss. NR 20.02(1)(d) and 20.03(1)(f)2. and 3.; and creating s. NR 25.09(2)(a)10.d. of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to fishing regulation housekeeping changes for 1988.

#### Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Authorizing Statutes: ss. 29.085, 29.174(3), 29.33(1), 227.11(2)(a) and 227.16(2)(e), Stats.

Statutes Interpreted: ss. 29.085 and 29.174(2), Stats.

The rules are primarily "housekeeping" changes in the fishing regulations. The specific changes include:

- 1. Clarifying eight rules for grammar and plainness purposes.
- 2. Clarifying the trout and salmon bag limits on Lake Michigan, Green Bay and the tributary streams and making permanent the extension of the Lake Superior lake trout season from Labor Day to September 30. (Emergency rule FM-60-86(E) originally extended this season but expired October 8, 1987.)
- 3. Repealing the experimental walleye regulation on Pine Lake, Iron County, since the rule lacked local support and was never implemented.
- 4. Clarifying the chub quota periods in Lake Michigan to resolve conflicting dates in the code.
- 5. Clarifying requirements for periodic raising of commercial nets in Lake Michigan and Green Bay as originally intended.

SECTION 8. NR 20.04(3)(c) is amended to read:

NR 20.04(3)(c) Except for streams posted pursuant to ch. NR 26, there shall-be is no closed season for hook and line fishing for any species of fish except lake trout, sturgeon, smallmouth bass and largemouth bass on any stream tributary to Lake Michigan or Green Bay, upstream to the first dam or lake except the Kewaunee river where this rule applies upstream to the third county highway "C" bridge.

#### SECTION 9. NR 20.06(1)(b)(intro.) is amended to read:

NR 20.06(1)(b) <u>Trolling</u>. No person may fish in the inland waters of the state from a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any boat in tow of a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any sailboat when in motion; or by means of shutting or drawing off water for that purpose. Casting and immediate retrieval of a bait or lure while positioning a boat by means of an electric motor, where motors are permitted, is not trolling. The restrictions in this paragraph do not apply to the waters of Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas, Polk, Racine, Rusk, Taylor, Washburn and Waukesha counties, the Wisconsin river <u>including sloughs</u>, bayous and flowages from county trunk A east of Tomahawk, Lincoln county, downstream, except lake Mohawksin, the Chippewa river including sloughs, bayous and flowages up to the flowing portion of all tributary streams from the Holcombe flowage, Chippewa county, downstream, the Fox river from Buffalo lake downstream to the DePere dam and the following named lakes and rivers including their flowages and sloughs:

SECTION 10. NR 20.12(6)(b) is amended to read:

NR 20.12(6)(b) Whole or live bait fish may not be used on lakes Butte des Morts, Little Butte des Morts, Poygan, Winnebago and Winneconne, Winnebago county, lake Poygan, Waushara and Winnebago counties and the Black river, Jackson and La Crosse counties.

SECTION 11. NR 25.07(2)(a)3.b.2) is amended to read:

NR 25.07(2)(a)3.b.2). No permittee may take more than 40% of the maximum amount established in subpar. b. 1) during any one of the quota periods of July 1 through September 30, October 1 through Beeember-31 January 15, or March 15 1 through June 30.

SECTION 12. NR 25.09(2)(a)10.a. is amended to read:

NR 25.09(2)(a)10.a. Once every 24 hours (1 day) in open water less than 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep for mesh-sizes-larger-than-2-3/4-ineh-stretch measure-in-Lake-Michigan-and-for all mesh sizes in Green Bay and Lake Michigan except as provided in sub. d.

SECTION 13. NR 25.09(2)(a)10.d. is created to read:

NR 25.09(2)(a)10.d. Once every 120 hours (5 days) in open water less than 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep for mesh sizes of not more than 2 3/4 inch stretch measure in Lake Michigan.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on February 25, 1988.

The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2) (intro.), Stats.
