PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE : BA

ADOPTING RULES

AN ORDER to create B 8, relating to barber licensing requirements.

Analysis prepared by the department of regulation and licensing.

ANALYSIS

In this proposal, chapter B 8 is added to the Barber code. Section B 8.01 sets forth the formal requirements for application for licensure. Section B 8.02 sets forth the requirements for licensure by endorsement. These requirements are detailed specifications of the general requirement of s. 457.11(4)(a) that a licensee by endorsement must have, in his or her state of original licensure, "met the requirements for obtaining the license which meet or exceed the requirements for licensure under this section."

ORDER

Pursuant to the authority vested in the barbers examining board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.11(2)(a) and (b), and 457.02(1), Stats., the barbers examining board hereby adopts rules interpreting ss. 457.11(1), 457.11(4)(a), and 457.12(2), Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. B 8 is created to read:

LICENSURE

B 8.01 APPLICATION FOR LICENSE. (1) An applicant for license as a master barber shall submit to the board:

- (a) An application on a form approved by the board;
- (b) A current passport-type photograph of the applicant;
- (c) The fee specified in s. 440.05(1), Stats.; and
- (d) Evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant has met the requirements for licensure contained in s. 457.11(1), Stats.
- (2) An applicant for license as a shop manager shall submit to the board:
 - (a) An application on a form approved by the board;
 - (b) A current passport-type photograph of the applicant;

- (c) The fee specified in s. 440.05(1), Stats.; and
- (d) Evidence satisfactory to the board of meeting the requirements for licensure contained in s. 457.12(2), Stats.
- B 8.02 ENDORSEMENT. An applicant who holds a valid barber license from another jurisdiction may apply for license as a master barber by endorsement. The applicant shall submit to the board:
 - (1) An application on a form approved by the board;
 - (2) A current, passport-type photograph of the applicant;
 - (3) The fee specified in s. 440.05(2), Stats.; and
 - (4) Evidence satisfactory to the board that:
 - (a) The applicant is at least 18 years of age;
- (b) The applicant has completed an apprenticeship substantially equivalent to that required in s. 457.11(1)(b), Stats.;
- (c) The applicant holds a valid barber license issued by the proper authority in any state, territory or possession of the United States or in any country; and
- (d) The applicant satisfactorily passed, in the applicant's jurisdiction of licensure, a written examination on standard barbering subjects and a practical examination on all services required on the Wisconsin master barber examination.

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.22(2), Stats.
