## ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AMENDING RULES

- An order to amend PI 3.01 (15), PI 3.05 (3m) (intro.), (a) (intro.), and (13) (a), PI 3.06
- 2 (title) and (intro.), PI 4.01 (5h), PI 4.02 (3) (d) and (e), and PI 4.095 (1) (title) and (intro.);
- to repeal and recreate PI 4.12; and to create PI 3.065, relating to early childhood
- 4 level licenses and approved programs.

## ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory Authority: s. 115.28 (7), Stats.

Statutes Interpreted: ss. 115.28 (7) and 118.19 (3), Stats.

Section 115.28 (7), Stats., requires the state superintendent of public instruction to license all teachers for the public schools and to make rules establishing standards of attainment for licensure. This section also requires the state superintendent to prescribe by rule standards and procedures for the approval of teacher preparatory programs leading to licensure in Wisconsin. Chapter PI 3 contains the rules which a person must meet to be licensed as a teacher in Wisconsin. Chapter PI 4 contains the procedures and standards for approving the professional education programs leading to licensure.

These proposed amendments to chs. PI 3 and 4 will amend the requirements for licenses and program approval in early childhood education. Current rules do not require completion of an early childhood level program to extend an elementary or an elementary/middle license to include kindergarten and/or nursery school, and may require as little as the completion of one additional course and student teaching. Further, current practice allows a person who holds a K-6 or a K-9 license to teach 4-year-old kindergarten, even though the person may not have completed course work or a student teaching experience at the nursery school level.

These proposed amendments will establish an early childhood level license which will permit a person to teach prekindergarten through grade 3 (the term nursery school will no longer be used). The rules will require completion of a minor in an early childhood education program. A person who wishes to extend an elementary (1-6) license to include early childhood must complete an early childhood program in addition to the elementary program. (The early childhood program may be completed as the minor which is required in the elementary program.) A person wishing to extend an elementary/middle license to include early childhood must complete the early childhood program in addition to the minor required in the elementary/middle program. A person may no longer be licensed only for kindergarten.

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Revisor of Statutes Bureau These amendments will ensure that all persons who hold a license to teach kindergarten or prekindergarten will have completed a program which includes developmentally appropriate educational theory and practice for children age birth through 8.

The proposed rules were drafted following recommendations of a committee appointed by the state superintendent to make recommendations on early childhood licenses and programs, and were reviewed by the State Superintendent Advisory Council on Teacher Licenses.

The rules will be effective for any person who completes an approved program after July 1, 1992.

The applicant shall have completed student teaching in prekindergarten, in kindergarten and in at least one of grades 1 through 6.
  - (3) To be issued a license to teach both early childhood and elementary/middle level education, an applicant shall have completed an approved program under s. PI 3.08 and an approved program under this section. The approved program under this section shall be completed in addition to the minor required under s. PI 3.075 (1) (b). The applicant shall have completed student teaching in prekindergarten, in kindergarten, in at least one of grades 1 through 6, and in another of grades 6 through 9.

- (6) The program shall require study and experiences designed to develop skills in promoting parent education and family involvement in the early childhood level program.
- (7) The program shall require study of professionalism, program and staff development, supervision and evaluation of support staff, advisory groups, community agencies and resources, and pupil services personnel as related to early childhood programs.
- (8) The program shall require study to develop knowledge of and the abilities to apply developmentally appropriate assessment tools with children birth through age 8.
- (9) The program shall require study designed to develop knowledge and skills to identify and teach children birth through age 8 with exceptional educational needs and talents.
- (10) The program shall require study of program, curriculum, and instructional approaches which contribute to the preparation of pupils for work including career exploration, practical application of the basic skills, and employability skills and attitudes.

These rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
