ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD AMENDING RULES

IN THE MATTER of amending ss. NR 520.04(1)(intro.) . & (a) and (2) and NR 520 Tables 1 and 2 of the . Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to solid . SW-26-89 waste license and plan review fees .

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 144.44(10) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats. Statutes interpreted: s. 144.44(10), Stats.

Section 144.44(10), Stats., authorizes the department to establish plan review fees to recover the anticipated costs of conducting solid waste review activities and to adopt a graduated schedule of reasonable license fees. This rule revises the solid waste plan review and license fees schedules to reflect the actual staff time spent on these activities and remedy the problems created by the current revenue shortfall. The changes to this rule are:

- 1. Increase solid waste plan review and license fees.
- 2. Collect additional license fees from collection and transportation operators with more than one truck in use for solid waste transportation.
 - 3. Simplify the fees schedules.
 - 4. Change biennial to an annual license fee collection process.
 - 5. A new fee for transfer of a license.

SECTION 1. NR 520.04(1)(intro.), (a) and (2) are amended to read:

NR 520.04(1) ISSUANCE OF AN OPERATING LICENSE. No person may operate or maintain a solid waste facility without an operating license from the department unless an exemption is granted under s. NR 500.08. The license period shall be a minimum of for one year.

(a) Application for an initial license for a new solid waste facility may be submitted at any time during the license period. Initial licenses issued during the license period shall expire at the end of that license period. Fees-for-initial licenses are proratable.—The license period-is-divided-into-6-month-periods. The applicant for initial licensing of a facility shall submit the appropriate fees as shown in Table 1 or Table 2, "Fee Schedule", whichever is applicable.

⁽¹⁾ The plan review fees specified in Table 2 cover the department's review from initial submittal through approval or denial of the report or plan. An applicant may withdra and revise or supplement a report or plan prior to it being deemed complete and resubmit it without paying an additional review fee. The applicant shall pay a plan review fee as specified in Table 2 for resubmittal of a plan which has been withdrawn after having been determined to be complete.

The department may waive any plan review fee if determines that the total review time is not likely to exceed 4 hours.

⁽⁵⁾ For an initial site report submittal which includes more than one location, the applicant shall pay a separate fee, as shown in Table 2, for each location.

⁽⁵⁾ The applicant shall pay a maximum 2-year license fee of \$1600 for landfills which are licensed to accept only wastewater treatment plant sludge, ash, foundry waste, wood waste demolition waste and other wastes of a similar nature not requiring daily cover pursuant to ch. NR 506.

⁽⁶⁾ A plan modification, as referred to in Table 2, is a submittal which proposes to modify a feasibility report, plan of operation or closure plan previously approved by th department. This fee also applies to a submittal which proposes to change the design management zone (DMZ) or requests recalculation of indicator preventive action limit (PAL's) as defined in ch. NR 140. The fee applies to facilities which request a modification to the DMZ or indicator PAL's and have an approved plan of operation and the sample of the sample

^(/) This review fee also applies to construction documentation reports for which a design capacity cannot be applied, such as sedimentation basins or remedial actions.

These review fees apply to each facility construction documentation report submitted.

⁽⁹⁾ This fee also applies to any facility which requests an exemption to the groundwater standards contained in ch. NR 140.

This fee is a one-time payment only for the term of the licensee's long-term care responsibility.

⁽¹¹⁾ This fee applies to each phase of construction to a maximum of \$5000 (10 inspections).

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on June 29, 1989.

The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
