ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN
NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
RENUMBERING, REPEALING AND RECREATING AND CREATING RULES

IN THIS MATTER of renumbering s. NR 46.23; .
repealing and recreating s. NR 46.30(2)(a), .
to (c) and creating ss. NR 46.17(2) and .
46.23(2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code .
pertaining to administration of the Forest .
Crop Law and Managed Forest Law. .

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 77.91(1) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.
Statutes interpreted: ss. 77.06(2) and 77.91(1), Stats.

Section NR 46.17(2), is repealed and recreated to establish a minimum width of 120 feet for managed forest land with an exception for segments of land on which the length to width ratio does not exceed 4 to 1. This revision is designed to exclude from designation long narrow segments of land unsuitable for forest management.

For purposes of the Forest Crop Law and Managed Forest Law, this rule repeals and recreates s. NR 46.30(2)(a) to (c) to revise annual stumpage values used to calculate severance and yield tax due on timber cut during the period from November 1, 1989 through October 31, 1990 from land entered as forest cropland or designated as managed forest land as required by ss. 77.06(2) and 77.91(1), Stats. Thirteen separate zones reflect varying stumpage values for different species and products across the state.

Section NR 46.23(2) is created to establish eligibility requirements for managed forest land transferred to a new owner which are equivalent to eligibility requirements for initial designation and land remaining after a transfer. The statute makes no direct reference to such requirements for transferred land.

SECTION 1. NR 46.17(2) is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 46.17(2) MINIMUM WIDTH. The minimum width of managed forest land is 120 feet except that segments less than 120 feet in width are permitted if the length to width ratio does not exceed 4 to 1.

SECTION 2. NR 46.23 is renumbered NR 46.23(1).

SECTION 3. NR 46.23(2) is created to read:

NR 46.23 (2) If land transferred under s. 77.88(2)(a), Stats., does not meet the eligibility requirements under s. 77.82(1)(a)2. and (b), Stats., the department shall issue an order withdrawing the land and assess the tax under s. 77.88(5), Stats., against the transferee.

SECTION 4. NR 46.30(2)(a) to (c) are repealed and recreated to read:

NR 46.30(2)(a) Logs (stumpage value per M board feet measure, 1000 1"x12"x12").
