

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN
LAKE MICHIGAN COMMERCIAL FISHING BOARD
CREATING RULES

.
IN THE MATTER OF creating s. NR 25.07(2) .
(br) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code .
pertaining to commercial fishing for . FM-44-89
yellow perch on Lake Michigan and Green .
Bay .

Analysis Prepared by the Lake Michigan Commercial Fishing Board

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174(3), 29.33(7) and 227.11(2)(a),
Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085, 29.174(1) and (2) and 29.33(1)
and (7), Stats.

The rules establish criteria for the allotment of individual
licensee catch quotas and for allocation among individual fishers
of harvest limits established by the department by Natural
Resources Board Order FM-40-88 (Clearinghouse Rule 88-173).

Paragraph (br) establishes criteria by which a fisher may qualify
for a yellow perch fishing permit in zone 3 and establishes a
formula for allotment of the zone 3 yellow perch harvest limit.

SECTION 1. NR 25.07(2)(br) is created to read:

NR 25.07(2)(br) Yellow perch in zone 3. 1. No person may
fish for yellow perch with commercial gear in zone 3 unless the
person has a permit for that zone issued by the department under
this paragraph.

2. A yellow perch fishing permit and individual licensee
catch quota for zone 3 shall be issued to each applicant who
holds a commercial fishing license issued under s. 29.33, Stats.,
reported a commercial harvest of yellow perch legally taken from

zone 3 between January 1, 1984 and December 31, 1988 and, effective July 1, 1990, applied for and received a yellow perch fishing permit for zone 3 for the license year preceding the license year for which the permit application is being made, unless unavoidable circumstances prevented application for or receipt of that previous year's permit. Those circumstances shall be reviewed by the Lake Michigan commercial fishing board which shall approve or deny the pending permit application.

3. Each permittee shall be allowed a total annual harvest or individual licensee catch quota of yellow perch assigned as a percentage of the harvest limit established by s. NR

25.06(2)(b)3. Each individual licensee catch quota shall be determined by dividing the total commercial harvest of yellow perch from zone 3 during the period from January 1, 1984 to December 31, 1988, reported under that license by the total reported commercial harvest of yellow perch from zone 3 during that period, and multiplying the result by 100.

4. If the number of eligible permittees for zone 3 is inadequate to utilize the harvest limit established by s. NR 25.06(2)(b)3., and allocated by subd. 3., the surplus shall be divided among the eligible permittees based on the percentages calculated for each permittee under subd. 3.

5. In determining individual licensee catch quotas under subd. 3., the resulting percentages shall be rounded off to

hundredths of a percent. The individual licensee catch quotas shall be allocated in whole pound increments.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Lake Michigan Commercial Fishing Board on June 19, 1989.

The foregoing rules were approved by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on June 29, 1989.

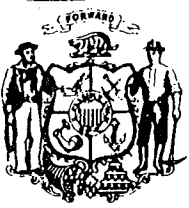
The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided by s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
