An order to amend A-E 4.02 (2) and 4.08 (1) (b) of the administrative code, relating to applications for certification as an engineer-in-training and the duration of the principles and practice of engineering examination.

### ANALYSIS

Statute interpreted: s. 443.01 (2), Stats.

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b), 227.11 (2), ch. 443, Stats.

In this rulemaking order the Examining Board of Architects, Professional Engineers, Designers and Land Surveyors proposes to amend A-E 4.02 to include certification as an engineer-in-training, and in A-E 4.08 to modify the duration of the examination.

#### TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. A-E 4.02 (title) and 4.02 are amended to read:

A-E 4.02 (title) <u>APPLICATIONS</u>. An-application <u>Applications</u> for <u>certification as an engineer-in-training and</u> registration as a professional engineer is are available upon request to the board office located at 1400 East Washington Avenue, Madison, Wisconsin 53702. An applicant who files an application but who does not comply with a request for information related to the application within one year from the date of the request shall file a new application.

SECTION 2. A-E 4.08 (1) (b) is amended to read:

A-E 4.08 (1) (b) The principles and practice examination requires the ability to apply engineering principles and judgment to problems in general engineering fields such as chemical, civil, electrical and mechanical fields. Questions involving economic analysis and the design needs of people with physical disabilities and relevant statutes and codes shall be included. The duration of the examination is 16 8 hours, administered over-a-2-day-period in one day.
