AN ORDER to amend Med 7.07 (1); and to repeal and recreate Med 7.04 (3) (a) of the administrative code relating to identification of the test provider used for the written portion of the physical therapy examination and the passing grade.

ANAYLSIS

Statute interpreted: s. 448.05(6)

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.11(2)(a), 448.05 (6), Stats.

In this order the rules of the Medical Examining Board in Med 7.07 (1) are modified to reflect a change in the specific identification of the test provider for the written portion of the physical therapy examination. As the department changes examination services, it does not want to identify the specific agency providing exam questions. In Med 7.04 (3) (a), it is required to identify determination of the passing score on the examination.

#### TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. Med 7.04 (3) (a) is repealed and recreated to read:

Med 7.04 (3) (a) The score required to pass the written physical therapy examination shall be based on the board's determination of the level of examination performance required for minimum acceptable competence in the profession and on the reliability of the examination. The passing grade shall be established prior to giving the examination and shall be designated by a grade of 75.

SECTION 2. Med 7.07 (1) is amended to read:

Med 7.07 Temporary license prior to regular license. (1) An applicant for license to practice physical therapy who has achieved passing grades on the Professional-Examination-Services Physical-Therapy-Examination physical therapy examination given by the board or of whom the board will require no further written examinations under the provisions of s. Med 7.04 (3) (b) may also apply to the board for temporary license prior to regular license. Such application shall be made not less than 30 days prior to the date set by the board for the holding of its next examinations for license. The applications
