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Revisor of Statutes Bureau The Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations proposes to renumber ILHR 45.08 (3); to amend ILHR 45.05 (56), ILHR 45.07 (1) (a) and ILHR 45.10; and to create ILHR 45.08 (3) (a), relating to mechanical refrigeration.

Analysis of Proposed Rules

Statutory Authority: ss. 101.02 (1), 101.02 (15) (h) to (j) and 101.17

Statutes Interpreted: s. 101.17

The Division of Safety and Buildings within the Department is responsible for adopting and enforcing rules relative to the protection of the life, health, safety and welfare of employes and frequenters in public buildings and places of employment. The provisions of chapter ILHR 45 contain safety and health rules relating to the design, construction, installation, operation and inspection of mechanical refrigeration systems.

The proposed rules consist of miscellaneous changes in chapter ILHR 45 in order to correct some inconsistencies and to codify current administrative practices. The definition of "secondhand vessel" is being amended by deleting the reference to change of ownership. This definition will then be consistent with chapters ILHR 11 and 41-42. The minimum size of Group 1 systems required to be registered and inspected at installation is being lowered from 100 tons to 50 tons. Also, Group 1 systems of 50 tons or more will be subject to an inspection once every 36 months. The proposed rules also delete the reference to the fee for the installation registration of mechanical refrigeration systems.

SECTION 1. ILHR 45.05 (56) is amended to read:

ILHR 45.05 (56) "Secondhand pressure vessel" means a pressure vessel that has changed both location and-ownership subsequent to the original installation.

SECTION 2. ILHR 45.07 (1) (a) is amended to read:

ILHR 45.07 (1) (a) Any system or unit system using a Group 1 refrigerant and having a capacity rated at or greater than 100 $\underline{50}$ horsepower, 100 $\underline{50}$ tons or 100,000 volt-amperes.

SECTION 3. ILHR 45.08 (3) is renumbered ILHR 45.08 (3) (b).

SECTION 4. ILHR 45.08 (3) (a) is created to read:

ILHR 45.08 (3) PERIODIC INSPECTIONS. (a) Any mechanical refrigeration system or unit system using a Group 1 refrigerant and having a capacity rated at or greater than 50 horsepower, 50 tons or 50,000 volt-amperes shall be subject to inspection by the department at least once every 36 months.

SECTION 5. ILHR 45.10 is amended to read:

<u>ILHR 45.10 FEES</u>. Fees for the registration-of-mechanical-refrigeration systems, certificate of operation, inspections and petitions for modification variance shall be submitted as specified in ch. Ind 69.

SECTION 6. ILHR A45.07 (2) Form SB-34 is replaced with a revised form dated 1/87.
