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ORDER OF THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE

AND OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE PATIENTS COMPENSATION FUND

AMENDING AND CREATING A RULE

To amend Ins 17.01 (3) (intro.) and 17.28 (3) (c) 2 and 3 and (6) (intro.) and to create Ins 17.35 (2m), relating to patients compensation fund fees and mediation fees for fiscal year 1991-92, classification of anesthesiologists and policies issued by risk retention groups.

This rule establishes the annual fees that health care providers participating in the patients compensation fund (fund) must pay for fiscal year 1991-92. These fees were approved by the board of governors of the fund at its meeting on February 20, 1991. Based on the recommendations of the fund's actuaries, the fees for all classes of health care providers will remain the same as the fees charged for fiscal year 1990-91. The fees collected for the operation of the mediation system operated by the director of state courts also remain unchanged.

The board of governors recommends a change in the classification of anesthesiologists from fund Class 3 to fund Class 2, based on continued improvement in the claims experience of this speciality group. This rule incorporates that recommendation, resulting in a reduction of an anesthesiologist's annual fee from \$12,854 to \$5,142.

The rule also requires any risk retention group that markets medical malpractice insurance to fund participants to place a notice on its application form notifying the applicant that the Wisconsin insurance security fund is not available to pay claims if the group becomes insolvent, and, in that event, the provider will be personally liable for paying claims up to the statutory limits of liability (currently \$400,000 per claim/\$1,000,000 annual aggregate).

SECTION 3. Ins 17.35 (2m) is created to read:

Ins 17.35 (2m) RISK RETENTION GROUPS. If the policy is issued by a risk retention group, as defined under s. 600.03 (41e), Stats., each new and renewal application form shall include the following notice in 10-point type:

## NOTICE

Under the federal liability risk retention act of 1986

(15 U.S.C. ss. 3901 to 3906), the Wisconsin insurance security fund is not available for payment of claims if this risk retention group becomes insolvent. In that event, you will be personally liable for payment of claims up to your limit of liability under s. 655.23 (4), Wis. Stat.

SECTION 4. <u>INITIAL APPLICABILITY</u>. The creation of section Ins 17.35 (2m) by this rule first applies to applications taken on the first day of the 3rd month beginning after the effective date of this rule.

SECTION 5. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. This rule will take effect on the first day of the first month after publication, as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
