ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of repealing ss. NR 28.01(3); renumbering . ss. NR 28.01(1) to (7); amending ss. NR 28.03(2)(b) and . (4)(a); repealing and recreating ss. NR 28.01(3) and . 28.03(3); and creating ss. NR 28.01(1), (4), (9), (10), . 28.03(4)(e) and 28.04 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code . ER-8-91 pertaining to wild ginseng regulations.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.547 and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 29.547, Stats.

The proposed rule:

- 1. Brings the definition of "wild ginseng" in line with the definition in the statutes (29.547, Stats.).
- 2. Creates definitions for "carry-over roots", "woods-grown ginseng", and "engage in business".
- 3. Limits the time frame for legal wild ginseng sales by harvesters.
- 4. Allows for paid employees and family members of licensed dealers to conduct wild ginseng transactions at the dealer's primary place of business.
- 5. Changes the due date for the annual report required of all licensed dealers.
- 6. Requires licensed wild ginseng dealers to annually submit inventory reports of all ginseng still in their possession as of March 31 of each year.
- 7. Limits wild ginseng harvest to only larger and mature plants.
- 8. Requires harvesters to plant all seed from harvested plants in the vicinity of the original plants.
- 9. Clarifies that "woods-grown ginseng" is technically cultivated ginseng and may not be bought or sold under the pretext of a wild ginseng license.
- 10. Clarifies that ginseng may not be harvested on any lands owned or administered by the state.

SECTION 1. NR 28.01(3) is repealed.

SECTION 2. NR 28.01(1) to (7) are renumbered to be:

NR 28.01 (2) "Dealer"

NR 28.01 (3) "Department"

NR 28.01 (5) "Green Ginseng"

NR 28.01 (6) "Harvest"

NR 28.01 (7) "Own land"

NR 28.01 (8) "Transaction"

SECTION 3. NR 28.01(1) is created to read:

NR 28.01(1) "Carry-over roots" are those wild ginseng roots still in the possession of licensed dealers or harvesters after March 31 of the year following the harvest season.

SECTION 4. NR 28.01(4) is created to read:

NR 28.01(4) "Engage in business" in this chapter includes but is not limited to purchasing, selling, holding, brokering, billing or receiving payment for, contracting for or advertising wild ginseng either for cash or on consignment.

SECTION 5. NR 28.01(9) is created to read:

NR 28.01(9) "Wild ginseng" means dry root, live root, seed or other parts of American ginseng (Panax guinquefolius) that is not grown or nurtured by a person.

SECTION 6. NR 28.01(10) is created to read:

NR 28.01(10) "Woods-grown ginseng" means ginseng that has been nurtured in any way by humans, including but not limited to watering, weeding, use of pesticides, soil tillage and fertilization.

SECTION 7. NR 28.03(2)(b)1. is amended to read:

NR 28.03(2)(b)1. Wild ginseng harvested in a lawful manner and with a valid harvest license may be sold by the licensee at any time from September 1 to March 31, both dates inclusive.

SECTION 8. NR 28.03(3) is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 28.03(3) DEALER'S LICENSE. All persons who engage in business with wild ginseng in Wisconsin shall have a valid Wisconsin wild ginseng dealer's license in their own name, except for paid employees or family members of a licensed dealer who are working at that dealer's primary place of business as indicated on the dealer's license.

SECTION 9. NR 28.03(4)(d) is amended to read:

NR 28.03(4)(d) Annual report. An annual report of all transactions shall be made to the department by each licensed wild ginseng dealer on forms provided by the department. The reports shall be submitted to the department by July 10 April 15 following the end of the license year. These reports shall cover all transactions from April 1 of the year of harvest through March 31 of the year following harvest.

SECTION 10. NR 28.03(4)(e) is created to read:

NR 28.03(4)(e) <u>Inventory report</u>. An inventory report of all wild ginseng remaining in the dealer's possession after March 31 of each year shall be made by each licensed wild ginseng dealer on forms provided by the department. Any carry-over roots shall be weighed and certified by department officials except that permission may be granted by the department to allow certification of carry-over roots by a certified public accountant familiar with wild ginseng. The report shall be submitted to the department by

April 15 each year even if the dealer has no carry-over roots in his or her possession. Dealers shall retain a copy of the inventory report and record on it all information requested by the department regarding all further sales of carry-over roots. An amended report shall be submitted to the department within 30 days after all carry-over roots are sold or upon request by the department.

SECTION 11. NR 28.04 is created to read:

- NR 28.04 Limitations and restrictions. (1) LIMIT OF PLANTS TO BE HARVESTED. Wild ginseng plants shall be harvested only if they possess 3 or more true leaves and mature fruit. The entire stalk, minus the mature fruits, shall be left attached to the plant until they are taken to the harvester's home or place of business.
- (2) SEED PLANTING. When harvesting wild ginseng, harvesters shall plant all of the seeds from the harvested plants in the immediate vicinity of the parent plants in a manner which will encourage their germination and growth. Wild seed may not be sold or transported away from the site of the parent plant.
- (3) WOODS-GROWN GINSENG. No person may harvest, sell or purchase woods-grown ginseng under the auspices of a wild ginseng license. All woods-grown ginseng is considered 'cultivated ginseng' and is regulated by the cultivated ginseng program under the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection under s. 94.50, Stats.
- (4) STATE-OWNED LANDS. No person may harvest wild or woodsgrown ginseng from any properties owned or administered by the state of Wisconsin.
