ORDER ADOPTING RULE

Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: ss. 85.16(1), 85.30 and 227.11(2), Stats.

STATUTE INTERPRETED: s. 85.30, Stats.

General Summary of Rule. The revision to the rule relates to the Motorcycle Safety Program funds administered by the Department. The revision allows for the Experienced Rider Course to be funded as well as the Basic Rider Course, allows for some financial assistance for range rental and painting when necessary, allows for a one-time reimbursement payment to instructor candidates if under \$100, and allows contracting with instructors to provide special services at special events if necessary.

<u>Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. This rule amendment will have no adverse impact on small businesses.

<u>Final Fiscal Estimate</u>. No significant fiscal impact is anticipated from the amendments to this rule.

TEXT OF RULE

Under the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, department of transportation, by ss. 85.16(1), 85.30 and 227.11(2), Stats., the department of transportation hereby amends a rule interpreting s. 85.30, Stats., relating to the motorcycle safety program.

SECTION 1. Trans 503.03(1) is amended to read:

Trans 503.03(1) Basic Motorcycle riding courses.

SECTION 2. Trans 503.04(title), (1), (3)(intro.) and (c), (6) and (7)(b) are amended to read:

Trans 503.04(title) MOTORCYCLE RIDING COURSES. (1) APPLICATION AND CONTRACT. Upon application and approval, the department shall enter into grant contracts with applicants for the reimbursement of expenses incurred in conducting basic motorcycle riding courses.

- (3) COURSE REQUIREMENTS. To be eligible for reimbursement, a basic riding course shall meet the following minimum requirements:
- (c) The applicant shall be solely responsible for renting the course site, furnishing any necessary audio-visual equipment and painting the driving range.
- (6) REPORTING REQUIREMENT. The grant recipient shall provide the department with the following information within 30 days after completion of any basic riding course for each student who has completed the course: name, address, driver license number, sex, date of birth, course location, date of graduation, and instructor's name and certification number.

(7)(b) If there is a need for instructors and the procedure under par. (a) is not adequate to meet the need, the department may reimburse the training costs of approved persons. Reimbursement may cover tuition, course material, meals, lodging and any pre-approved additional expenses. The department shall reimburse the person for 50% of these costs after successful completion of the training, and shall reimburse the remaining 50% after the person newly trained instructor has conducted taught an entire basic riding course. If costs are less than \$100 in claimed expenses, the entire amount will be paid once the newly trained instructor has taught an entire riding course.

SECTION 3. Trans 503.05 is amended to read:

Trans 503.05 PUBLIC AWARENESS PROGRAMS. The department shall aid other organizations in the promotion of type 1 motorcycle safety by furnishing them with educational and informational materials for display and distribution. The department's participation in

activities under this section shall not extend beyond the furnishing of materials. The department may contract with certified instructors to provide services and programs related to public awareness of type 1 motorcycle safety in this area.
