ORDER OF THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE AMENDING AND CREATING A RULE

To amend Ins 6.61 (16) and create Ins 6.59 (8) (e), Wis. Adm. Code, relating to change in residency status and notification of other regulatory actions.

ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE Statutory authority: ss. 601.41 (3) and 628.04 (3), Stats.

Section 1. This section currently does not include a provision regarding nonresident licensees changing residences from one state to another. Since Wisconsin nonresident licensing is based on licensing and certification by the state of residency, it is necessary to adopt uniform procedures to assure this.

Section 2. This amendment will require agents to notify the commissioner of other regulatory actions.

SECTION 1. Ins 6.59 (8) (e) is created to read:

Ins 6.59 (8) (e) A licensed nonresident agent, after becoming a resident of a state other than Wisconsin, may retain agent licensing authority under the nonresident agent license for a maximum of 60 days, at which time all authority granted under the nonresident license shall cease, unless a

letter of certification from the new state of residence is provided to the commissioner.

SECTION 2. Ins 6.61 (16) is amended to read:

Except for action taken by the Wisconsin office of the commissioner of insurance, each intermediary shall notify the commissioner in writing within 30 days of any felony conviction, misdemeanor conviction other than a misdemeanor conviction related to the use of a motor vehicle or the violation of a fish and game regulation, or any formal disciplinary action against the intermediary taken by any state's insurance regulatory agency, commission or board or other regulatory agency which licenses the person for any occupational activity. The notification shall give a description of the conviction or disciplinary action.

SECTION 3. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. This rule will take effect on the first day of the month after publication as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
