ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CREATING/AMENDING RULES



The state superintendent of public instruction hereby repeals PI 3.36(1) and (2), amends PI 3.03(2)(c), (5)(a) and (b), PI 3.05(6)(b), PI 3.075(2), PI 3.08(2), PI 3.21(3) and (4), PI 3.22(3)(a), PI 3.23(intro.), PI 3.37, PI 3.55(2)(intro.), PI 4.025(1)(intro.), PI 4.10(5)(c), PI 11.24(7)(a) and (8)(a), and PI 11.33(5), creates PI 3.03(5)(c), and PI 3.05(3p), (3s), and (3v), relating to licenses and approved programs.

ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: ss. 115.28(7) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statute interpreted: ss. 115.28(7), 118.19(1) and (3)(a), and 227.11(2)(a)Stats.

Section 115.28(7), Stats., requires the state superintendent of public instruction to license all teachers for the public schools and to make rules establishing standards of attainment for licensure. This section also requires the state superintendent to prescribe by rule standards and procedures for the approval of teacher preparatory programs leading to licensure in Wisconsin. The proposed rules make several technical modifications in chapters PI 3, 4 and 11 and make the following amendments:

Amendments to Chapter PI 3:

Chapter PI 3 contains the rules which an individual must meet to be licensed in Wisconsin.

Currently, occupational therapists must be certified by the department of regulation and licensing, medical examining board. Since the examining board's requirements surpass the requirements for a school occupational therapist license under ch. PI 3, s. PI 3.36 has been amended to allow a person to be issued a school occupational therapist license if that person is certified as an occupational therapist by the department of regulation and licensing, medical examining board. Further, under s. PI 3.03(2)(c), a school occupational therapist is exempt from the continuing professional education requirement for renewal

of a school occupational therapist license.

Currently, a person may be issued a one-year license to serve as an administrator if that person meets the requirements under s. PI 3.55(2). However, this one-year license is not included in s. PI 3.03(5) which states the conditions under which a one-year license may be obtained. Therefore, this provision has been added to s. PI 3.03(5) for clarity.

In order to receive a regular initial license, an out-of-state applicant who lacks the student teaching experience as specified under s. PI 3.05(6), must complete 2 consecutive semesters of full-time classroom teaching under the supervision of the employing school district administration and a college or university supervisor in a Wisconsin institution. The proposed rule eliminates the required supervision from a college or university supervisor in a Wisconsin institution.

The general requirements for a license to teach at the early childhood (grades PK-3), elementary level (grades 1-6), and elementary/middle level (grades 1-9) shall include 12 semester credits in the integrated study of the content, methods, scope and sequence of mathematics, social studies, and science curricula as taught at the early childhood, elementary level, and elementary/middle level.

The proposed rule prohibits persons holding a license at the elementary level and the elementary/middle level to teach a foreign language with less than a licensing minor in the foreign language. Because teaching at the elementary and elementary/middle level requires completion of a general education program and does not require a major or minor in order to teach certain subjects, this exemption from teaching a foreign language will prevent a teacher from instructing in an area for which that teacher is not prepared.

Amendments to Chapter PI 4:

Chapter PI 4 contains the procedures and standards for approval of professional education programs leading to a license.

An institution may have an experimental or innovative program which is not in compliance with the rules under ch. PI 4 if approved by the department. Current rules require the state superintendent to hold a public hearing in order to approve an experimental or innovative program prior to its implementation. The proposed rule eliminates the public hearing requirement.

Chapter PI 4 currently sets forth general education requirements which are common to all teacher education programs. Specific course work has been included in the proposed rules for elementary or elementary/middle level programs.

As one of the requirements to be a cooperating teacher, current rules state that a cooperating teacher has to have completed a course or seminar in the supervision of student teachers or interns or to have successful service as a cooperating teacher prior to July 1, 1988. The year 1988 is an error which occurred in a previous rule revision. The original date which was in effect, is still considered the official date, and is included in this proposed rule is July 1, 1977.

Amendments to Chapter PI 11:

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Chapter PI 11 relates to children with exceptional educational needs. A physical therapist must be licensed and an occupational therapist must be certified by the Wisconsin department of regulation and licensing, medical examining board and must be licensed by the department in order to provide services to children with exceptional educational needs in a local education agency. These provisions have been clarified in ch. PI 11.

SECTION 1. PI 3.03(2)(c) as affected by CHR 91-23 is amended to read:

PI 3.03(2)(c) Exemption from the continuing professional education requirement. The continuing professional education requirement under par. (b) is not required for renewal for the school occupational therapist license under s. PI 3.36, the school physical therapist license under s. PI 3.37, the substitute teacher license under sub. (8), the substitute educational interpreter - hearing impaired license under sub. (9), or the special education program aide license under s. PI 3.39.

SECTION 2. PI 3.03(5)(a) and (b) as affected by CHR 91-23 is amended to read:

PI 3.03(5)(a) To an applicant who has not met the continuing education requirement for renewal of a regular license under sub. (3)(e) (2)(b). This one-year license may not be renewed. For renewal of the regular license, the applicant shall meet the requirements under sub. (3)(e) (2)(b).

(b) To an applicant who meets the license requirements under this chapter, but who has not been regularly employed in the teaching profession within the 5 consecutive years immediately preceding application for the license or renewal, upon the written request of an employing school district administrator. For issuance or renewal of the regular license, the applicant shall meet the refresher work requirement under sub. (3)

SECTION 3. PI 3.03(5)(c) is created to read:

PI 3.03(5)(c) To an applicant who has not met the regular license requirements under subch. XII, but who meets the requirements for an administrator's license as specified under s. PI 3.55(2).

SECTION 4. PI 3.05(3p), (3s), and (3v) are created to read:

- (3p) MATHEMATICS, EFFECTIVE AUGUST 31, 1994. An applicant for an early childhood, elementary, or elementary/middle level license who completes an initial professional education program on or after August 31, 1994, shall have satisfactorily completed at least 12 semester credits in the integrated study of the content of mathematics, methods of teaching mathematics, and the scope and sequence of mathematics curricula as taught at the early childhood, elementary, and elementary/middle levels.
- (3s) SOCIAL STUDIES, EFFECTIVE AUGUST 31, 1994. An applicant for an early childhood, elementary, or elementary/middle level license who completes an initial professional education program on or after August 31, 1994, shall have satisfactorily

completed at least 12 semester credits in the integrated study of the content of social studies, methods of teaching social studies, and the scope and sequence of social studies curricula as taught at the early childhood, elementary, and elementary/middle levels.

(3v) SCIENCE, EFFECTIVE AUGUST 31, 1994. An applicant for an early childhood, elementary, or elementary/middle level license who completes an initial professional education program on or after August 31, 1994, shall have satisfactorily completed at least 12 semester credits in the integrated study of the content of science, methods of teaching science, and the scope and sequence of science curricula as taught at the early childhood, elementary, and elementary/middle levels.

SECTION 5. PI 3.05(6)(b) is amended to read:

PI 3.05(6)(b) A one two-year minor deficiencies license under s. PI 3.03(4) may be issued to an applicant who has completed an out-of-state college or university approved student teaching experience of less than full days for a full semester, but who lacks the 2 semesters of regular classroom teaching. Issuance of a regular license shall require successful completion of 2 consecutive semesters of full-time classroom teaching experience under the supervision of the employing school district administration and a college or university supervisor in a Wisconsin institution who meets the requirements of s. PI 4.10(2)(f).

SECTION 6. PI 3.075(2) is amended to read:

PI 3.075(2) A license under this section permits the holder to teach any subject, except a foreign language, in a self-contained class in any of grades 1 through 6; and the
