ORDER ADOPTING RULE

Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: s. 85.16(1) and s. 85.20, Stats.

STATUTES INTERPRETED: s. 85.20, Stats., and 49 U.S.C. Appx. § 1607

General Summary of Rule. This rule changes the method of allocating the federal funding received under section 9 of the Urban Mass Transit Act of 1964, as amended. The rule establishes an initial combined state and federal operating assistance cap of 70% of operating expenses so that funds will be available for capital funding needs. Any excess over the amount needed for capital funding needs shifts back to provide additional funding for operating assistance, over and above the 70% cap.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>. No significant fiscal impact is anticipated from the promulgation of this rule change.

<u>Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. This proposed rule has no significant adverse impact on small businesses.

TEXT OF RULE

Under the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, department of transportation, by s. 85.20, Stats., and 49 U.S.C. Appx. § 1607, the department of transportation hereby amends a rule interpreting s. 85.20, Stats., relating to the urban mass transit operating assistance program.

SECTION 1. Trans 8.03(1)(a) and Trans 8.03(3) are amended to read:

Trans 8.03(1)(a) Funds apportioned to the governor and available for operating assistance shall be allocated annually among eligible recipients in proportion to each

recipients recipient's share of the projected operating expenses of all eligible recipients for the project year. No recipient may receive an allocation that exceeds 50% of its operating deficit for any project year in accordance with 49 U.S.C. § 1607a(k)(1); and no recipient shall receive an allocation that when combined with state s. 85.20, Stats., operating assistance funds exceeds 70% of its projected operating expenses.

(3) Any uncommitted balances of the governor's apportionment after capital assistance needs are met under sub. (2)(a) shall be available to all eligible applicants for operating assistance beyond the 70% limitation initially imposed in sub. (1)(a), not to exceed 50% of the operating deficit or the federally-imposed operating assistance cap. Any uncommitted balances of the governor's apportionment available after this additional operating assistance distribution or any unexpended balances from previous years under this section shall be carried forward to the following year.
