ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b), 227.11 (2), 448.01 (11) and 448.02 (3), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 448.01 (11), Stats.

In this order the Medical Examining Board is amending s. Med 10.02 (2) (q) as this subsection does not include licensees of the board who have had action taken against them by an agency of the federal government. The amendment would provide the board with the authority to proceed under this rule to institute action against a licensee who has had action taken by the federal government as a federal employee.

TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. Med 10.02 (2) (q) is amended to read:

Med 10.02 (2) (q) Having a license, certificate, permit, er registration, or other practice privilege granted by another state or by any agency of the federal government to practice medicine and surgery or treat the sick limited, restricted, suspended, or revoked, or having been subject to other disciplinary action by a the state licensing authority thereof or by any agency of the federal government.
