ORDER OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYE TRUST FUNDS - OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY and EMPLOYE TRUST FUNDS BOARD WISCONSIN RETIREMENT BOARD TEACHERS RETIREMENT BOARD

To amend s. ETF 10.10 (10) relating to the election committee for the Teachers Retirement Board elections; and to repeal and recreate s. ETF 20.015 relating to the definition of one-third of full-time employment.

ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYE TRUST FUNDS

<u>Statutory Authority</u>: Sections 40.03 (1) (m), (2) (i), (7) (d) and (8) (d), Wis. Stats.

Statutes Interpreted: Sections 40.03 (2) and 40.22 (2) (a), (2m) (a) and (3) (b), Wis. Stats.

General Summary of Rule: S. 40.03 (2) (p), Stats., requires the secretary of the department of employe trust funds to establish procedures for and conduct elections of some members of the Teachers Retirement Board. S. ETF 10.10 (10), Wis. Admin. Code, requires the secretary to serve on the elections committee which makes final decisions on the validity of questionable ballots. The proposed amendment would allow the secretary to designate an alternate to sit on the elections committee.

S. ETF 20.015, Wis. Admin. Code, currently provides that a person classified as a teacher under s. 40.02 (55), Stats., who is employed with the expectation that there will be at least 440 hours of actual performance of duty during an annual earnings period with that employer shall be deemed to be employed one-third of what is considered full-time with that employer and thereby meet the 600 hours requirement of s. 40.22 (1) (b) and (2), 1981 Stats.

These references are obsolete. Sections 40.22 (1) to (4) were repealed and recreated by 1989 Wisconsin Act 13. Sections 40.22 (2) (a), (2m) (a), and (3) (b), 1989 Stats., authorize the department to define one-third of full-time employment for all classes of employes. S. 40.22 (2m) (b) requires that employes be included under the Wisconsin Retirement System no later than upon completion of 600 hours of work in the immediately preceding 12-month period. ETF 20.015 is being recreated to define one-third of full-time employment as 600 hours for non-teachers and 440 hours for teachers in one 365-day period.

SECTION 1. ETF 10.10 (10) is amended to read:

ETF 10.10 (10) An election committee shall be appointed by the teachers retirement board and shall consist of the secretary of the department or the secretary's designee and 2 teachers retirement board members not running for reelection. A majority of the election committee shall determine the validity of questionable ballots.

SECTION 2. ETF 20.015 is repealed and recreated to read:

ETF 20.015 PARTICIPATING EMPLOYES: ONE-THIRD OF FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT

- (1) NON-TEACHERS. Except as provided in sub. (2), for purposes of s. 40.22, Stats., 600 hours of employment with an employer in one year is considered one-third of full-time employment.
- (2) TEACHERS. For an employe classified as a teacher under s. 40.02 (55), Stats., for purposes of s. 40.22, Stats., 440 hours of employment with an employer in one year is considered one-third of full-time employment.
- (3) YEAR. For purposes of this section "year" means 365 consecutive calendar days, or 366 consecutive calendar days if the period measured includes February 29.

SECTION 3. Effective Date: This rule shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Wis. Stats.
