ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION CREATING/AMENDING RULES

The state superintendent of public instruction hereby renumbers PI 3.14(intro.); renumbers and amends PI 3.08(1)(c), PI 3.10(1)(c), PI 3.392, PI 3.55(3)(a) and PI 4.81(1); amends PI 3.03(2)(c), (2)(e)3, PI 3.05(2)(title) and (intro.), (2m)(title), (intro.) and (b), (3)(title), (a) and (b) and (3m)(title) and (intro.) and (3p), (3s), and (3v), PI 3.06(title) and (intro.), PI 3.065(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.07(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.075(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.08(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.09(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.10(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.11(title) and (intro.), PI 3.115(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.55(3)(c)2, PI 4.11(3), PI 4.81(3)(intro.) and (a) through (n), PI 4.83(3), and PI 4.84(1); and creates PI 3.03(6)(b)3, PI 3.08(1)(c)2, PI 3.10(1)(c)2, PI 3.14(2), PI 3.365, PI 3.375, PI 3.55(3)(a)2, PI 4.81(1)(b), and PI 4.81(3)(b) relating to teacher licenses and approved teacher preparation programs.

ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: ss. 115.28(7) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statute interpreted: ss. 115.28(7), 118.19(1) and (3)(a), and 118.192, Stats.

Section 115.28(7), Stats., requires the state superintendent of public instruction to license all teachers for the public schools and to make rules establishing standards of attainment for licensure. This subsection also requires the state superintendent to prescribe by rule standards and procedures for the approval of teacher preparatory programs leading to licensure in Wisconsin. The proposed rules make several technical modifications in chapters 3 and 4 and make the following amendments:

Amendments to Chapter PI 3:

Chapter PI 3 contains the rules which an individual must meet to be licensed in Wisconsin.

The proposed rule eliminates the provision which allows no more than 3 semester credits earned as equivalent clock hours at a workshop, seminar or conference to be counted toward renewal of an educational interpreter-hearing impaired license. The proposed rule also allows a person who has been successfully employed by a school or school district as an educational interpreter for the equivalent of at least 50% time for 2 semesters prior to July 1, 1992, to be issued an educational interpreter license.

The proposed rule creates a mathematics and science permit as provided under 1991

Wisconsin Act 108. The 2-year permit authorizes the holder to assist teaching in mathematics and science and may be issued to a person who meets the requirements under s. 118.192(2), Stats. and who has completed a 100 hour training program established by the state superintendent.

The proposed rule requires specific attention be given to the history, culture and tribal sovereignty of the federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands located in this state as part of the human relations provision of the general requirements for a license.

The professional education sequences at the early childhood, elementary, or elementary/middle level will require a person (except a person who enters a Wisconsin institution before July 1, 1993) to complete 3 semester credits each in the study of mathematics, social studies and science curriculum, including scope and sequence of the content taught at each level. A person who enters a Wisconsin institution before July 1, 1993, also does not have to meet the original 12 semester credits required under the professional education sequences.

The proposed rule provides for a single student teaching assignment for applicants who seek an internship under s. PI 3.03(7) in order to receive a license to teach elementary/middle level education: grades 1-9 and middle/secondary level education: grades 6-12.

The proposed rule creates a provision which allows a person who holds a middle, middle/secondary or secondary license to teach a foreign language and who has taught a foreign language successfully at the elementary level for at least 2 semesters prior to July 1, 1992, to be issued a regular license to teach the foreign language in grades kindergarten through 12.

The proposed rule creates licenses for school occupational therapy and school physical therapist assistants. The continuing professional education requirement is not required for renewal of these licenses.

The proposed rule specifies that a person applying for a local vocational education coordinator license does not have to complete an approved specialist degree program or the equivalent and a person applying for a business administrator license does not have to complete graduate course work in the supervision of instruction.

Amendments to Chapter PI 4:

Chapter PI 4 contains the procedures and standards for approval of professional education programs leading to a license.

The proposed rule specifies that the study of American Indians under s. PI 4.11(3), includes

specific instruction related to Wisconsin's federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands and shall include instruction specific to their tribal sovereignty.

The proposed rule specifies that programs for school business administrators do not require the undergraduate or graduate study of child psychology, early adolescent psychology, adolescent psychology or human growth and development from birth to adult and do not require graduate study in the supervision of instruction.

The program requirements leading to licensure as a principal and director of instruction requires graduate study of the coordination of special education programs. The term "special education program" is misleading since it seems to refer to programs for children with exceptional educational needs. The department has always applied a broader meaning which includes any special school program, such as gifted and talented, at risk, special education, etc. Therefore, the term "special education programs" has been changed to "special school programs."

The permit may be renewed if, between the date of issuance and the proposed renewal date, the applicant satisfactorily completes at least 2 semester credits or the equivalent of continuing professional education directly and substantively related to the permit held by the applicant or to the applicant's professional competency. The requirement under this subparagraph may be waived if an extraordinary circumstance exists and if the waiver is approved by the state superintendent.
- f. The district administrator of the employing school district or his or her designated official shall submit to the state superintendent, by September 1 annually, an explanation of how the mathematics and science programs will be enhanced by the employment of a person holding a permit under this subdivision.

The district administrator of the employing school district or his or her designated official, within 30 days after the end of the school year in which a permit holder was employed, shall submit a report to the state superintendent that explains how the mathematics and science programs were enhanced including an explanation of the role of the permit holder.
