

I am submitting the following information for the filing of the above rule.

### Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

#### Businesses Affected:

The amendments to the atrazine use rule will affect small businesses in Wisconsin. The greatest small business impact of the rule will be on users of atrazine: farmers who grow corn. There are an estimated 1,000 - 1,500 corn growers in the proposed Prohibition Areas, and approximately 40,000 corn growers subject to reduced statewide rates of atrazine use. About half of the State's corn growers use atrazine and are small businesses, as defined by s. 227.114 (1)(a), Stats. Secondary effects may be felt by distributors and applicators of the pesticide, crop consultants and equipment dealers. Since the secondary effects relate to identifying and assisting farmers in implementing alternative weed control methods, these effects will most likely result in additional or replacement business and the impacts are not further discussed in this document.

Specific economic impacts of alternative pest control techniques are discussed in the environmental impact statement for this rule.

#### Reporting, Recordkeeping and Other Procedures Required for Compliance:

For use statewide, the maximum application rate for atrazine is based on soil texture. This may necessitate referring to a soil survey map or obtaining a soil test. While this activity is routine, documentation would need to be maintained to justify the selected application rate. A map delineating application areas must be prepared if the field is subdivided and variable application rates are used. This procedure is already required under the existing statewide atrazine regulation.

All users of atrazine, including farmers, will need to maintain specific records for each application. This procedure is already required under the existing statewide atrazine regulation.

Atrazine cannot be used in certain areas of the State where groundwater contamination already exceeds the atrazine enforcement standard in s. NR 140.10 Wis. Adm. Code.

#### Professional Skills Required to Comply:

The rule affects how much atrazine can be applied and on which fields. Because overall use of atrazine will be reduced statewide, alternative weed control techniques may be needed in some situations. These techniques may include different crop rotations, reduced atrazine rates, either alone or in combination with other herbicides, or combinations of herbicides and mechanical weed control measures.

While alternative weed control techniques are available, adoption of these techniques to individual farms will in some cases require assistance. In the past this type of advice has been provided by University Extension personnel and farm chemical dealers. In recent years many farmers have been using crop consultants to scout fields, identify specific pest problems and recommend control measures. The department anticipates these three information sources will continue to be used as the primary source of information, both on whether atrazine can be used and what alternatives are likely to work for each situation.

#### Comments From Legislative Committees

On January 13, 1993 the rule was referred to the Senate Committee on Urban Affairs, Financial Institutions and Environmental Resources and the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources for review. On February 3, 1993 the Senate Committee on Urban Affairs, Financial Institutions and Environmental Resources held a public hearing. Attached are the rule modification request and the Department's response.

Thank you for your letter informing the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) of the executive action taken by your Senate Committee on Urban Affairs, Environmental Resources & Elections on proposed changes to ch. Ag. 30, Wis. Admin. Code, relating to the use of atrazine (Clearinghouse Rule 92-142).

The Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection continues to believe that a statewide ban on the use of atrazine is not appropriate based on existing information. We feel that ch. Ag 30, Wis. Admin. Code (the Atrazine Rule) is working to protect groundwater and public health and fully complies with the Groundwater Law.

Consistent with the Groundwater Law, the Atrazine Rule prohibits atrazine use wherever it is found to exceed the health-based groundwater Enforcement Standard. The proposed revisions to the Atrazine Rule would establish over 50 additional prohibition areas covering approximately 1 million acres. This is a dramatic expansion compared to the existing rule. Most of Dane County and the entire Lower Wisconsin River Valley are included as proposed prohibition areas. Other parts of the state, including corn producing counties, have had few or no detects above the enforcement standard. Where there are such findings, the rule establishes localized bans. We feel a statewide ban would be unfair to growers in broad areas of the state where there are only a few localized findings.

Although we do not support a statewide ban at this time, we agree that a ban should continue to be considered as an option as new data become available. In fact, we have a plan to gather data needed to evaluate the success of the atrazine rule over time. We are directed by the existing atrazine rule to conduct statistically designed surveys of atrazine in groundwater at two and four years after the promulgation of the original atrazine rule in April, 1991. Bases on these two surveys, the rule

In order to protect Wisconsin groundwater, this rule restricts the use of atrazine pesticides on a statewide basis. It also prohibits the use of atrazine in areas where groundwater contamination levels attain or exceed state enforcement standards.

#### Statewide Restrictions

Current rules restrict the use of atrazine pesticides on a statewide basis. Current rules restrict the use of atrazine to certified applicators, restrict the timing of atrazine applications, require applicators to keep detailed application records, and prohibit atrazine applications for non-agricultural purposes. Current rules also limit the rate at which atrazine may be applied.

Under current rules, atrazine may be applied at a maximum annual rate of 1.0 lb. per acre for coarse soils, and 1.5 lbs. per acre for medium- to fine-textured soils. An additional 0.5 lbs. per acre may be used on sites which did not receive an atrazine application in the preceding year. (The combined maximum rate of 1.5 to 2.0 lbs. per acre compares to a rate of 3 lbs. per acre permitted under the current federally approved label, and 4 lbs. per acre allowed under prior federal labels.) The current rules also designate 5 "atrazine management areas" where the maximum application rate is limited to 0.75 lbs. per acre for coarse soils and 1.0 lbs. per acre for medium- to fine-textured soils.

This rule establishes a statewide maximum application rate of 0.75 lbs. per acre per year for coarse soils and 1.0 lbs. per acre per year for medium- to fine-textured soils. An additional 0.5 lbs. per acre may be used on medium- to fine textured soils which did not receive an atrazine application in the preceding year. (If a rescue treatment is needed for seed corn or sweet corn, the rescue treatment may exceed this maximum rate, provided that the total amount of atrazine product applied to the site in any calendar year does not exceed 1.5 lbs. per acre for coarse soils, or 2.0 lbs. per acre for medium- to fine-textured soils.)

The rule eliminates current "atrazine management areas," because the new statewide application rate is very similar to the current rate which applies in those areas. However, new "atrazine management areas" may be created in the future.

#### Atrazine Prohibition Areas

Ch. ATCP 30 currently directs the department to prohibit atrazine use on a localized basis, where appropriate under the groundwater law. Atrazine prohibition areas are established where atrazine contamination equals or exceeds the current groundwater enforcement standard under ch. NR 140, Wis. Adm. Code. Current rules prohibit atrazine use in 11 designated areas.

The rule creates a total of 54 prohibition areas throughout the state. These include several large prohibition areas, such as those encompassing the lower Wisconsin river valley and much of Dane and Columbia counties. The proposed rule includes maps describing each of the prohibition areas.

Within every prohibition area, atrazine applications are prohibited. Atrazine mixing and loading operations are also prohibited unless conducted over a spill containment surface which complies with ss. ATCP 29.151(2) to (4).

#### Annual Report

Under the rule, the department must report annually to the board of agriculture, trade and consumer protection. In its report, the department must indicate the results of statewide groundwater tests for atrazine, including all results exceeding the enforcement standard or preventive action limit. The report must also discuss the results of the department's investigations related to atrazine in groundwater, significant trends or developments related to atrazine in groundwater, and other information which the department considers relevant to the regulation of atrazine.

Based on groundwater test results and other relevant information, the department must annually evaluate its restrictions on the use of atrazine. As part of its annual report to the board, the department must recommend further restrictions on atrazine use which the department considers necessary. This may include recommendations for statewide restrictions or prohibitions, atrazine management areas or atrazine prohibition areas.

If, as part of its annual report, the department recommends further restrictions on the use of atrazine, the department must offer draft rules to implement its recommendations. If the board declines to adopt final draft rules, or approves final draft rules that differ from the department's hearing draft rules, the department must identify each modification as part of the department's report to the legislature under s. 227.19, Stats. Except in an emergency, the department must transmit its final draft rules to the legislature by January 1 of each year.




#### ATRAZINE USE PROHIBITION AREAS



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
