

Relating to Atrazine Use Restrictions

The Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection hereby submits the following information for filing with the above rule.

Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

Businesses Affected:

The amendments to the atrazine use rule will affect small businesses in Wisconsin. The greatest small business impact of the rule will be on users of atrazine: farmers who grow corn. The proposed prohibition areas contain approximately 60,000 acres. Assuming that 50% of this land is in corn and that 50% of these acres are treated with atrazine, then 15,000 acres of corn will be affected. This acreage would represent between 80 and 225 producers, depending on their corn acreage. These producers are small businesses, as defined by s. 227.114 (1)(a), Stats. Secondary effects may be felt by distributors and applicators of atrazine pesticides, crop consultants and equipment dealers. Since the secondary effects relate to identifying and assisting farmers in implementing alternative weed control methods, these effects will most likely result in additional or replacement business and the impacts are not further discussed in this document.

Specific economic impacts of alternative pest control techniques are discussed in the environmental impact statement for this rule.

Reporting, Recordkeeping and Other Procedures Required for Compliance:

The maximum application rate for atrazine is based on soil texture. This may necessitate referring to a soil survey map or obtaining a soil test. While this activity is routine, documentation would need to be maintained to justify the selected application rate. A map delineating application areas must be

prepared if the field is subdivided and variable application rates are used. This procedure is already required under the existing statewide atrazine regulation.

All users of atrazine, including farmers, will need to maintain specific records for each application. This procedure is already required under the current atrazine rule.

Atrazine cannot be used in certain areas of the State where groundwater contamination already exceeds the atrazine enforcement standard in s. NR 140.10 Wis. Adm. Code.

Professional Skills Required to Comply:

The rule affects how much atrazine can be applied and on which fields. Because overall use of atrazine will be reduced statewide, alternative weed control techniques may be needed in some situations. These techniques may include different crop rotations, reduced atrazine rates, either alone or in combination with other herbicides, or combinations of herbicides and mechanical weed control measures.

While alternative weed control techniques are available, adoption of these techniques to individual farms will in some cases require assistance. In the past this type of advice has been provided by University Extension personnel and farm chemical dealers. In recent years many farmers have been using crop consultants to scout fields, identify specific pest problems and recommend control measures. The department anticipates these three information sources will continue to be used as the primary source of information, both on whether atrazine can be used and what alternatives are likely to work for each situation.

Comments From Legislative Committees

The rule was referred to the Senate Committee on Transportation, Agriculture, Local and Rural Affairs and to the Assembly Committee on Agriculture, Forestry and Rural Affairs on December 15, 1993. The department received no comments from either committee.

Statutory authority: ss. 93.07(1), 94.69(9), 160.19(2), and 160.21(1), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 94.69, 160.19(2) and 160.21(1), Stats.

In order to protect Wisconsin groundwater, current rules under ch. ATCP 30, Wis. Adm. Code, restrict the statewide rate at which atrazine pesticides may be applied. Current rules also prohibit the use of atrazine in areas where groundwater contamination levels attain or exceed state enforcement standards.

Based on new groundwater test data, this rule expands the number of areas in which atrazine use is prohibited. This rule also amends current rules to regulate land spreading of water containing atrazine.

Atrazine Prohibition Areas

Current rules prohibit the use of atrazine where atrazine contamination of groundwater equals or exceeds the current groundwater enforcement standard under ch. NR 140, Wis. Adm. Code. Current rules prohibit atrazine use in 54 designated areas, including major prohibition areas in the lower Wisconsin river valley and much of Dane and Columbia counties.

This rule repeals two current prohibition areas, repeals and recreates 3 current prohibition areas to expand those areas, and creates 19 new prohibition areas, resulting in a new total of 71 prohibition areas throughout the state. The rule includes maps describing each of the new and expanded prohibition areas.

Within every prohibition area, atrazine applications are

prohibited. Atrazine mixing and loading operations are also prohibited unless conducted over a spill containment surface which complies with ss. ATCP 29.151(2) to (4), Wis. Adm. Code.

The repealed prohibition areas are located in Sheboygan and Wood counties. These prohibition areas were created on the basis of an unofficial screening test which has not been confirmed by more recent official testing. (A recent official test showed atrazine levels well below the enforcement standard.) Other groundwater samples from these areas show either no indication of atrazine contamination or levels below the preventive action limit.

Land Spreading Soils and Water

Under current rules, the department may issue a permit authorizing any person to land spread soil containing atrazine residues in order to remedy soil contamination. The amount of atrazine and atrazine metabolites applied to a site by land spreading may not exceed the maximum application rates for atrazine active ingredient permitted under s. ATCP 30.10, Wis. Adm. Code.

Under this rule, the department may also issue a permit authorizing any person to land spread water containing atrazine residues in order to remedy groundwater contamination. The amount of atrazine and atrazine metabolites applied to a site by land spreading may not exceed the maximum application rates for atrazine active ingredient permitted under s. ATCP 30.10, Wis. Adm. Code.

Lower Wisconsin River Valley Prohibition Area

Current rules prohibit atrazine applications in the lower Wisconsin river valley. This rule exempts certain sections within the valley which are located on a high river terrace and have deep silty soils. Atrazine use in these sections is not considered a threat to groundwater because of the deep, finer textured soils and the absence of any detectable amount of atrazine from wells on this terrace.

"Lower Wisconsin river valley" means the river terraces and flood plain on either side of the Wisconsin river, downstream of the state highway 60 bridge at Prairie du Sac and upstream of the confluence of the Wisconsin and Mississippi rivers, except that atrazine may be applied to medium- and fine-textured soils in Township 9 North Range 1 West, sections 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33 and 34 and Township 9 North, Range 2 West, sections 25, 26, 27, 28, 32, 33, 34, 35 and 36 in compliance with ss. ATCP 30.05 through ATCP 30.10.
