## ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AMENDING RULES

The state superintendent of public instruction hereby amends PI 3.03(4), relating to the minor deficiencies license.

## ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: ss. 115.28(7), 121.02(1)(a), and 227.11(2)(a), Stats. Statute interpreted: ss. 115.28(7) and 118.19(1) and (3)(a), Stats.

Currently, an initial two-year minor deficiencies license may be issued to a person who has completed an approved program in another state but who has minor course work deficiencies required under this chapter. In order to renew a license, a person must complete at least 12 semester credits toward removal of the deficiencies. It has been found that persons cannot complete the required course work within the two-year initial license period.

The proposed rules provide for flexibility by allowing these persons to renew their minor deficiencies license until their minor deficiencies course work is completed.

SECTION 1. PI 3.03(4) is amended to read:

PI 3.03(4) An initial two-year license may be issued to an applicant who has completed an approved program in another state but who has minor course work deficiencies under this chapter. This license may be renewed <del>provided</del> that the person has completed at least 12 semester credits toward removal of <u>until</u> the deficiencies <u>have been removed provided the person is making</u> significant progress toward completing the requirements.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month commencing after the date of publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
