ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING AND CREATING RULES



IN THE MATTER OF repealing s. NR 20.03(1)(d); amending s. NR 20.02(1)(a)3., 20.02(1)(b) and (d)1., 20.03(1)(a)1.e., 20.03(1)(k)1m., (k)2., (q)1.a., (4)(g), (6)(d)1., (6)(d)3., 20.04(3)(am)24., (3)(c), (3)(d), 20.07(4)(a), 20.09(2)(g), (3)(b), (3)(c), (3)(e), 20.10(1)(b), 20.13(6), 21.06(1)(d), 26.02(70)(a), 26.22(64)(a); and creating s. NR 20.03(1)(a)10m., (1)(c)10m., (1)(d), 20.03(9), 26.01(52), 26.08(5)(b) and (c), 26.09(51), and 26.24(9) and (61) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to sport fishing and fish refuges

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174 and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085 and 29.174(2)(a), Stats.

In this order:

Section 1 establishes a minimum length limit for sauger in Lake Superior of 15 inches and prohibits the taking of more than 1 walleye or sauger greater than 20 inches in length;

Section 2 establishes a minimum length limit for northern pike in Lake Superior of 26 inches and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 to 2;

Section 3 lengthens the open season for lake trout in Lake Michigan;

Section 4 increases the minimum length limit for bass in Lazy lake, Columbia county, and Eagle lake, Racine county from 14 to 18 inches and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 to 1;

Section 5 reduces the daily bag limit for bass in Lake Wazee, Jackson county, from 5 to 2:

Section 6 reduces the daily bag limit for walleye in Lake Wazee, Jackson county, from 5 to 2;

Section 7 establishes a minimum length limit for northern pike of 26 inches and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 to 2 in 31 southern Wisconsin counties and in several northern Wisconsin waters. This section also establishes a minimum length limit for northern pike of 32 inches and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 to 1 in 9 waters and establishes a 40 inch minimum length limit for northern pike and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 to 1 in 3 waters;

Section 8 reduces the daily bag limit for panfish from 50 to 15 in Eagle lake, Racine county;

Section 9 reduces the daily bag limit for panfish from 50 to 10 in Lake Wazee, Jackson county;

Section 10 closes the hook and line sturgeon season in the Wisconsin river upstream from the dam at Wisconsin Dells;

Section 11 closes the early (1 January to the day before the first Saturday in May) trout fishing season in southwestern counties, increases the minimum length limit for trout in Big Green lake from 9 to 14 inches, and establishes a daily bag limit of 2 and a minimum length limit of 12 inches for trout in Lake Wazee;

Section 12 increases the minimum length limit for muskellunge from 32 to 40 inches in Park, Silver, Spring, and Swan lakes, Columbia county, Big Green lake, Green Lake county, and sections of the Brunet river (including Lake Winter) and Chippewa river (including Radisson flowage), Sawyer county;

Section 13 increases the minimum length limit for muskellunge in most waters statewide from 32 to 34 inches;

Sections 14 and 16 close the season for fishing for all species on small streams and roadside ditches adjacent to Green Bay, while leaving the outlying waters and mainstems of larger rivers open to sport fishing.

Section 15 redefines the lower Wisconsin river to include tributaries upstream to the first highway bridge;

Section 17 excludes a portion of the Peshtigo River from the restriction on night fishing for most tributaries to Green Bay and Lake Michigan;

Section 18 opens Fish creek slough, Bayfield county, to bowfishing from the Saturday nearest May 20 to July 1;

Sections 19, 20, 21, 23 and 25 close Lake Superior and its bays and tributaries to bait harvest;

Section 22 excludes Beaver Dam lake, Barron county, from inland waters open to dip netting for smelt;

Section 24 more clearly defines the fishing equipment that may not be possessed while spearing sturgeon;

Section 26 creates a fish refuge around the Root River Steelhead facility from January 1, 1995 to December 31, 1995;

Section 27 reduces the length of the refuge below the Eureka dam, Fox river, Winnebago county, from 500 to 200 feet;

Section 28 creates two fish refuges in Brown County from March 1 of each year to the date immediately preceding the opening date of the general fishing season.

Section 29 establishes a fish refuge on Schnur creek, Price county;

Section 30 amends the description of the fish refuge on Little St. Germain lake; and

Section 31 creates fish refuges on Otter creek, upstream and downstream from Otter lake, Chippewa and Taylor counties.

NR 20.03(9) SPECIAL CLOSURE FOR GREEN BAY TRIBUTARIES. (a) Notwithstanding the seasons established in sub. (1), there is a closed season for all hook and line fishing for all species of fish in the Green Bay tributary streams, rivers and ditches from the bay of Green Bay upstream to the first dam or lake from March 2 to the Friday immediately preceding the first Saturday in May except for the following waters:

- 1. Duck creek in Brown county beginning at the first dam above the Pamperin park foot bridge in the village of Howard, extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 2. Suamico river in Brown county beginning at the CTH "HS" bridge extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 3. The East river in Brown county beginning at the Hoffman Road (CTH "XX") bridge extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 4. The Little Suamico river in Oconto county beginning at the CTH "J" bridge extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 5. The Pensaukee river in Oconto county beginning at the CTH "J" bridge extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 6. The Oconto river in Oconto county from the Stiles dam extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 7. The Little river in Oconto county beginning at the highway 141 bridge extending downstream to the junction with the Oconto river.
- 8. The Peshtigo river in Marinette county from the Peshtigo dam extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.
- 9. The Little river in Marinette county beginning at the Rader road bridge extending downstream to the bay of Green Bay.

During this period, fishing with hook and line is prohibited between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise on all streams tributary to Lake Michigan and Green Bay except the Menominee river, Oconto river and its tributaries and, the Fox river, and the Peshtigo river from the downstream side of the railroad bridge at the NE 1/4, of the NE 1/4, section 30, township 30 north, range 23 east downstream to its mouth.

NR 20.09(2)(g) A Except in Lake Superior, its bays and tributaries, a dip net not exceeding 8 feet in diameter or 8 feet square may be used in all other waters except designated trout streams at any time of the year, sunrise to sunset, for the taking of rough fish with no bag or possession limit.

SECTION 20. NR 20.09(3)(b) is amended to read:

NR 20.09(3)(b) Dip nets not exceeding 8 feet in diameter or 8 feet square, may be used from April 1 to May 25 for the taking, catching, or killing of smelt and suckers in Lake Superior and all streams flowing into Lake Superior in Bayfield, Ashland and Iron counties and the Brule river in Douglas county from a point beginning at their mouths and extending inland for a distance of one-half mile in a straight line. Zoning does not apply on Bear creek, Bluff creek and Nemadji river, the St. Louis river and the other non-trout streams in Douglas county and in the waters of the Chippewa, Bad, and White rivers in Ashland county not inhabited by trout, or on streams where active sea lamprey control structures are located. The taking of

rough fish by dip netting is permitted from April 1 to July 15 below the posted portion of a stream on which such an active lamprey control structure is located.
