

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
REPEALING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of repealing ss. NR 10.01(2)(c)1.b., 10.01(3)(h)3., 10.11, 10.24(6)(c)2.c., and 10.27(5)(a); amending ss. NR 10.01(2)(c)1.a. and 2., 10.01(3)(em), 10.01(3)(h)1.a., 10.01(4)(c)1., 10.104(5)(a), 10.24(6)(c)2.b. and (d), 10.27(1) and 10.27(4); repealing and recreating ss. NR 10.01(4)(d), 10.10(1)(b), 10.31(1)(d)(map), 10.31(11)(map) and 10.34(1)(map); and creating ss. NR 10.36(map), 45.11(6)(k) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to hunting, trapping and motor boat use.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Satutory authority: ss. 29.174(3) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.174(2), 29.107, 29.1075 and 29.1085 Stats.

In this order:

Section 1. Pheasant season and bag limits - extends the pheasant season to December 31 and increases the daily bag limit from 1 to 2 early in the season.

Section 2. Pheasant season and bag limits - repeals special pheasant season and bag limits for a portion of Iowa county beginning in 1995.

Section 3. Bow season use of deer permits - allows hunters to use Hunter's Choice and bonus permits for antlerless deer during the archery seasons.

Section 4. Coyote hunting closure - expands the region closed to coyote hunting during the gun deer seasons to protect wolves.

Section 5. Coyote hunting closure - repeals closed area map.

Section 6. Beaver trapping - extends the beaver trapping season in Zone A to April 30.

Section 7. Otter trapping - repeals the current north and south zones and replaces them with north, central and south zones; increases the bag limit from 2 to 3 in the north zone and from 1 to 2 in the central zone.

Section 8. Bear dog hunting line - changes the bear dog hunting line to coincide with the boundary of bear hunting zones B and C in Marinette County.

Section 9. Bow season use of deer permits - allows hunters to use Hunter's Choice permits for antlerless deer during the archery seasons.

Section 10. Multiple bow deer tags - repeals system for issuing multiple tags for archery deer hunting.

Section 11. Bong Recreation Area hunting hours - extends the 9:00 a.m. opening time for small game hunting through the end of the pheasant season.

Section 12. Bong Recreation Area hunting hours - extends 2:00 p.m. hunting closure for all species except waterfowl and archery deer.

Section 13. Bong Recreation Area hunting hours - exempts waterfowl hunting south of highway 142 and archery deer hunting from the 2:00 p.m. hunting closure.

Section 14. State Park deer hunting - establishes Harrington Beach State Park as a deer management unit with a muzzleloader only restriction and establishes in Big Bay State Park a closed area for deer hunting and opens the archery season on October 15.

Section 15. State Park deer hunting - repeals normal state park deer hunting season framework for Big Bay State Park.

Section 16. Burnett County Canada goose subzone - reduces the size of this subzone.

Section 17. Early Canada goose hunt subzone - expands the size of this subzone to include additional portions of Lake Michigan and Sheboygan, Washington, Ozaukee, Dodge, Jefferson and Walworth counties.

Section 18. Pheasant Management Zone - adds the portion of Grant County south of County Trunk Highway P and State Highway 18 to the Pheasant Management Zone.

Section 19. Otter trapping zones - creates a map showing the new north, central, and south zones.

Section 20. Motor restrictions on Vernon Marsh Wildlife Area - restricts motor use to electric motors on boats using the flowages of Vernon Marsh Wildlife Area.



SECTION 9. NR 10.104(5) (a) is amended to read:

NR 10.104(5) (a) Hunter's choice deer hunting permit. Valid for the taking of one deer of either sex or age, except on Chambers Island in Door County where the bag limit shall be one antlerless deer or one buck deer with a forked antler as indicated on the permit. Hunter's choice deer hunting permits are only valid for antlerless deer if used during the archery season under the authorization of an archery hunting license.

SECTION 10. NR 10.11 is repealed.

SECTION 11. NR 10.24(6)(c)2.b. is amended to read:

NR 10.24(6)(b)2.b. The Sunday nearest October 17 and running for 13 consecutive days and continuing through the end of the pheasant season as established in s. NR 10.01(2)(c)--9:00 a.m.

SECTION 12. NR 10.24(6)(c)2.c. is repealed.

SECTION 13. NR 10.24(6)(d) is amended to read:

NR 10.24(6)(d) Special closure. The daily closing of hunting hours for all species is established in s. NR 10.06 except during pheasant season when all hunting except waterfowl south of state highway 142 and archery deer shall end at 2:00 p.m. after the Saturday nearest October 17.


SECTION 14. NR 10.27(1) and (4) are amended to read:

NR 10.27(1) MUZZLELOADER SEASON. Deer hunting by muzzleloader is allowed in Blue Mound, Brunet Island, Governor Dodge, Harrington Beach, Peninsula and Perrot state parks during the seasons specified in s. NR 10.01(3)(e).


(4) FIREARM AND BOW SEASONS. Deer hunting by firearm and bow and arrow is allowed in the Plum Island part of Grand Traverse Islands state park and that part of Big Bay state park located on Madeline Island west of a north-south line beginning at the park entrance on Haines road during the seasons specified in s. NR 10.01(3)(e)3. and (em) except that archery deer hunting would begin on October 15 at Big Bay state park.
