

ORDER OF THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE

REPEALING A RULE

To repeal Ins 6.06 (9) and Appendix 1 relating to requiring a certificate of compliance for property and casualty rates.

ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE

Statutory authority: ss. 601.41 (3), 601.42 (1), 625.01, 625.02 (3), and 625.11, Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 625.01, 625.02 (3), and 625.11, Stats.

This rule would delete the requirement that property and casualty rate filings include a certificate of compliance. The staff of the Office of the Commissioner of Insurance has found that this certificate is not needed and impedes the office's ability to process property and casualty rate filings efficiently.

SECTION 1. Section Ins 6.06 (9) and Appendix 1 are repealed.

SECTION 2. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. This rule will take effect on the first day of the first month after publication, as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
