ORDER

An order of the Chiropractic Examining Board to amend Chir 2.02 (4); and to repeal and recreate Chir 3.03 relating to licensure by endorsement.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b) and 227.11 (2), Stats., and s. 446.02 (3g) (b), Stats., as created by 1993 Wisconsin Act 31.

Statutes interpreted: s. 446.02 (3g) (a), Stats.

In this proposed rule-making order the Chiropractic Examining Board creates rules implementing provisions of 1993 Wisconsin Act 31, which provide the authority for the board to grant licenses for the practice of chiropractic in Wisconsin to chiropractors already licensed in other jurisdictions.

Under the authority granted by 1993 Wisconsin Act 31, these proposed rules set forth the educational prerequisites which are required of a chiropractor licensed in another jurisdiction who wishes to become licensed in Wisconsin. The education required is the same as that required for a person who seeks initial chiropractic licensure in Wisconsin.

In addition, the proposed rules require that the chiropractor applicant show that the examination required for licensure in the chiropractor's home jurisdiction is substantially equivalent to the examination required of applicants who seek their first chiropractic license in Wisconsin. In accordance with Act 31, the proposed rules further provide that the chiropractor applicant may be required to demonstrate continued competence in the profession by successfully completing a "Special Purpose Examination in Chiropractic" provided by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners for testing experienced chiropractors, if the applicant has not previously taken the examination of the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners.

The proposed rules further provide that a qualified applicant will have been practicing in another jurisdiction for at least 3 of the previous 5 years, and that no disciplinary action has been taken against the applicant's license in any jurisdiction in which the applicant has practiced.

The proposed rules set out the information which the applicant is required to provide in an application, in order to demonstrate that the applicant is eligible for a chiropractic license in Wisconsin without having to complete the licensing examination required of persons who have never been licensed to practice chiropractic in any jurisdiction.

TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. Chir 2.02 (4) is amended to read:

Chir 2.02 (4) A certified transcript from a chiropractic college which has recognized candidate status for accreditation or accredited status with by the commission on accreditation of the council on chiropractic education, or approved by the board, sent directly to the board by the college.

SECTION 2. Chir 3.03 is repealed and recreated to read:

- Chir 3.03 <u>LICENSURE BY ENDORSEMENT</u>. (1) QUALIFICATIONS. The board shall grant a license to a chiropractor who holds a valid license by the proper authorities of any other jurisdiction provided the applicant:
- (a) Does not have an arrest or conviction record subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, Stats.
- (b) Has graduated from a college of chiropractic accredited by the council on chiropractic education and approved by the board.
- (c) 1. Has graduated from a reputable college of chiropractic, if the applicant first applied for any license to practice chiropractic in any jurisdiction before July 1, 1960.
- 2. Has completed at least the first 2 years of a baccalaureate degree program at a college or university accredited by an accrediting body nationally recognized by the secretary of the United States department of education, if the applicant first applied for any license to practice chiropractic in any jurisdiction on or after July 1, 1960.
- 3. Has graduated with a baccalaureate degree from a college or university accredited by an accrediting body nationally recognized by the secretary of the United States department of education, if the applicant first applied for any license to practice chiropractic in any jurisdiction on or after July 1, 1998.
- (d) Has been engaged in clinical chiropractic case management at least 24 hours per week in one or more jurisdictions in which the applicant has a current license for at least 3 of the 5 years immediately preceding application in Wisconsin.

- (e) Has successfully completed a clinical examination which, in the board's judgment, is substantially equivalent to the practical examination administered by the board.
- (f) Has successfully completed the special purpose examination in chiropractic, if the applicant has not taken the examination of the national board of chiropractic examiners.
- (g) Has successfully completed a state law examination on the provisions of the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules relating to chiropractic.
- (h) Has not had a license or other credential limited, suspended or revoked by a licensing or regulatory authority in Wisconsin or other jurisdiction.
- (2) APPLICATION PROCEDURE. Each applicant shall file a completed, notarized application on forms provided by the board. The application shall include:
 - (a) The signature of the applicant.
 - (b) The fee specified under s. 440.05 (1), Stats.
 - (c) A current passport-type photograph of the applicant.
- (d) A certified transcript from a chiropractic college accredited by the commission on accreditation of the council on chiropractic education, or approved by the board, sent directly to the board by the college.
- (e) A certified transcript verifying that the applicant has a bachelor's degree from a college or university accredited by an accrediting body nationally recognized by the secretary of the United States department of education verifying a bachelor's degree if the applicant first applies for any license to practice chiropractic in any jurisdiction on or after July 1, 1998. The transcript shall be sent directly to the board by the college or university.
- (f) Verification of successful completion of a clinical examination. The verification shall be forwarded directly from the state that administered the examination.
- (g) Proof of successful completion of the special purpose examination in chiropractic in lieu of the examination of the national board of chiropractic examiners. The proof of completion shall be forwarded directly from the institution that administered the examination.
- (h) Proof of successful completion of the state law examination with a grade of 75 or above.
- (i) Verification of licensure status in all states in which the applicant is or has been licensed to practice chiropractic.

(j) Information requested by the board relating to any convictions or pending charges for criminal offenses.
