

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation adopts an order to amend TRANS 326.01(intro.), relating to motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: s. 227.11, Stats. **STATUTES INTERPRETED:** ss. 110.07, 110,075, 194.38 and 194.43, Stats.

<u>General Summary of Rule</u>. Chapter Trans 326 adopted motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials of the United States Department of Transportation in effect on November 1, 1993. This amendment changes the date from November 1, 1993 to November 1, 1995. This amendment allows Wisconsin to enforce the most recent version of the motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials. All vehicles operating in interstate commerce are already subject under federal law to any changes that have been adopted between November 1, 1993 and November 1, 1995.

<u>**Fiscal Impact</u>**. The Department estimates that there will be no fiscal impact on the liabilities or revenues of any county, city, village, town, school district, technical college district or sewerage district.</u>

<u>Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis</u>. This rule will not have any significant adverse effect on small businesses.

TEXT OF RULE

Under the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, department of transportation,

by s. 227.11, Stats., the department of transportation hereby amends a rule interpreting

ss. 110.07, 110.075, 194.38 and 194.43, Stats., relating to motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials.

SECTION 1. Trans 326.01(intro.) is amended to read:

<u>Trans 326.01 FEDERAL RULES ADOPTED</u>. The following federal <u>motor carrier</u> <u>safety</u> regulations adopted by the United States department of transportation and in effect on November 1, 1993 <u>1995</u>, are adopted by the department and shall be enforced in relation to those carriers, drivers or vehicles to which these federal rules apply in the same manner as though the federal regulations were set out in full in this chapter:
