

EXECUTIVE ORDER #192

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Chief Petty Officer Duff Gordon of the United States Navy, Who Lost His Life While Serving His Country During World War II

WHEREAS, on December 7, 1941, Chief Petty Officer Duff Gordon, of the U.S.S. Oklahoma, United States Navy, was killed in action when the U.S.S. Oklahoma was torpedoed by Japanese warplanes and capsized within minutes of the surprise attack on Pearl Harbor; and

WHEREAS, after that fateful day over seven decades ago, the remains of nearly 400 sailors and Marines killed aboard the U.S.S. Oklahoma could not be identified; and

WHEREAS, Chief Petty Officer Duff Gordon's remains were recently identified due to advances in forensic technology, and he is among the first of the previously unidentified U.S.S. Oklahoma servicemen to be identified and reburied; and

WHEREAS, on Wednesday, March 30, 2016, Chief Petty Officer Duff Gordon will be laid to rest in his hometown of Hudson, Wisconsin, nearly seventy-five years after sacrificing his life on behalf of his nation;

NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on Wednesday, March 30, 2016, and ending at sunset on that date.
