Chap. 156 An Act to amend Section two of Chapter one hundred and eight of the Revised Statutes.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

How suit may be brought.

SECTION 1. Section two, of Chapter one hundred and eight of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows: "Any one or more of the persons so holding lands may institute a suit in the circuit court for the county in which the lands, or any portion thereof lie, by a bill in equity for a division and partition thereof, according to the respective rights of the parties interested therein, and for a sale of such premises, if it shall appear that the partition thereof cannot be made without great prejudice to the owners: Provided, That when suit is thus instituted if the complainants bill does not ask for a division and partition or sale of all the lands so owned by the parties to the bill, either of the parties thereto may cause said bill to be so amended as to include all the lands thus owned: Provided also, That when there shall be no appearance on the part of the defendant or defendants to the suit, the complainant shall pay the costs of suit and partition, unless his bill of complaint asks for a division and partition or sale of all the lands owned by said parties as in the first section of this act mentioned, or unless the said defendant or defendants shall have been served with personal notice.
