Chap. 250

An Act to amend Chapter seventy of the Revised Statutes.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Probate Court may extend time of payment of debts in certain cases.

SECTION 1. The Probate Court may, on the application of the executor or administrator, from time to time as the circumstances of the estate may require, extend the time for paying debts and legacies, not exceeding six months at a time, nor so that the whole time allowed to the original executor or administrator shall exceed six years.

Repealing clause.

SEC. 2. Section thirty-two of chapter seventy of the Revised Statutes is hereby repealed.

Chap. 251

An Act to amend Section eight, Chapter five, of the Revised Statutes.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Copies of Laws remaining after distribution to be distributed to County Treasurers.

SECTION 1. The eighth section of chapter five, of the Revised Statutes of Wisconsin, is hereby amended as follows : The copies of the laws remaining after the distribution as provided in the fifth section of this chapter, shall be distributed to the Treasurers of the several counties of this state, by the Secretary of State according to the population of such counties ; provided that said secretary shall first deposit two hundred copies of the laws of each session of the Legislature in the State Library.

Treasurers may sell them at cost

SEC. 2 The Treasurers of the several counties shall be authorized to sell said copies of the laws so distributed to them at

cost, and shall pay over the money received on such sales to the State Treasurer.

An Act to change the time for making assessments and collections of taxes in the county of Portage Chap. 252

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The time for making the assessments upon property in said county is hereby changed from the time now fixed by the law of this State to the months of February in each year, and the time for the collection of taxes is hereby changed from the time now fixed by law to the month of April in each year. The town board of Supervisors to appoint one Assessor, and the Treasurer of each town in said county shall have the right to levy on property and sell the same by the above mentioned time as is now allowed by law for such purposes.

Time changed.
Duty of Town Supervisors and Treasurers.

SEC. 2. This law to take effect from and after its passage.

Chap. 253

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Benton and Garfield, the sum of six hundred and seventy-six dollars and twenty-nine cents, for candles and stationery furnished the Legislative Assembly in 1839, to be paid out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, which shall be in full for principal and interest of said debt.
