GENERAL AND SPECIAL STATUTES.

As Act to appropriate money to pay the mileage of the members of the Legislature.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Chap. 1. Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to be paid out $_{\text{Milesge of Sen}}$ of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appro- $\frac{1}{2}$ priated, on the warrant of the Chief Clerk of the Senate, the sum of three hundred and forty-six dollars and fifty cents: the amount due members of the Senate for their mileage.

SEC. 2. There is also hereby appropriated to be paid Milesge of Asout of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, on the warrant of the Chief Clerk of the Assembly, the sum of eleven hundred and fifty-six dollars and twenty cents, being the amount due members of the Assembly for their mileage.

As Ast to authorize an election in the City of Milwaukee. for or egainst the adoption of Chap. 2.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A special election shall be held in the seve-"al Wards of the City of Milwaukee at the usual places of holding elections by the Aldermen of each Ward, or under their direction, in the same manner, and conducted and certified in the same way, and under the same penalties as elections are by law holden in said city, for city and ward officers, on Monday, the second day of February next

between the hours of ten in the forenoon, and four in the afternoon; and at such special election, the male inhabitants of each ward of said city who are now qualified to vote for ward and city officers, may vote within their respective wards, a printed or written ticket, "For the Charter," or "Against the Charter"-and the result of such election, in each ward of said city, shall be certified by the said aldermen, or persons holding said election in each ward, or a majority of them, to the Common Council, who shall add up the same, and send a certified copy of the returns of said election to each of the Senators and Representatives of said city, in the Legislature.

This act shall take effect from and after its SEC. 2. passage.

Chap. 3. An Act to authorize the construction of a bridge across Platte River in Grant County.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorized build bridge.

SECTION 1. Henry L. Meassey, William Hull, and such other persons as are or may be associated with them, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain a bridge across Platte River in the County of Grant at the point where the road leading from Potosi to Galena crosses said river.

SEC. 2. The said Henry L. Meassey and William Hull and their associates shall have power to take and use so May use bigh- much of the public highway leading from Potosi to Galena, as may be necessary for the construction of such bridge: *Provided*, that no unnecessary damage is done thereby to said highway.

SEC. 3. The bridge authorized to be constructed by this Bridge to have a act shall not be less than 12 feet wide, and shall be condra w. structed with a draw over the channel of said river twenty' feet in width, so as to permit boats and vessels to pass through the same at all times free of charge, and without unnecessary delay.

SEC. 4. The persons authorized to construct said bridge, shall have power for the period of twenty years from and, after the completion thereof, to demand and collect toll for
