The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Any of the organized towns of this state Authorised to are hereby authorized by a vote of a majority of the voters construct bridge of such town, to creet and construct oridges across any of the navigable streams in this state, running through the towns creeting such bridge or bridges, and shall have power by a like vote of the town to levy taxes upon the taxable property of said town, to creet and maintain said bridge or bridges in the same manner that highway taxes are levied.

SEC. 2. The said bridges created under the provisions now construct of this act shall be so constructed as not to obstruct the navigation of the streams upon which they are created.

SEC. 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
