An Act to legalize certain acts and doings of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in Madison, Dane county.

Chap. 51.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The acts and doing of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in the village of Madison, Dane county, in the election of church officers, on the 29th day of June, A. D. 1847, are hereby declared to be legal and valid.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and shall be in force from and after its passage.

An Act relating to Plank Roads.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

Chap. 52.

SECTION 1. Every person who shall forcibly or fraudulently pass any toll gate erected on any plank road within this state, without having paid the legal toll, or who shall, to avoid the payment of legal toll, with his carriage or horse, or other vehicle or animal liable to toll, turn out of such road, or pass any gate thereon, on ground adjacent thereto, and enter again on such road, or who shall, for the purpose of avoiding the payment of toll, misrepresent to any gate keeper as to the place where he came on to the plank road, or as to the distance which he has traveled
