

Chapter 142.*Published June 8d, 1858.*

AN ACT to amend section two of an act entitled "An Act to organize the county of Kewaunee for judicial purposes."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendment.

SECTION 1. Section two of an act entitled "An Act to organize the county of Kewaunee for judicial purposes," is hereby amended so as to read as follows, to wit: Said county of Kewaunee shall be and hereby is constituted a part of the fourth judicial circuit, and one term of the circuit court shall annually be held in and for the said county of Kewaunee, to commence on the first Tuesday of July in each year.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chapter 143.*Published June 3d, 1858.*

AN ACT to amend chapter sixty-nine of the laws of 1858, entitled "An Act to authorize the printing of the Report of the Joint Committee to investigate into alleged frauds in the disposal of the Land Grants, and for other purposes," approved May 1st, 1858.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendment.

SECTION 1. Section two of an act entitled "An Act to authorize the printing of the report of the joint committee appointed to investigate into alleged frauds in the disposal of the land grants, and for other purposes," approved May 1st, 1858, is hereby amended by adding to the end of said section two, the following words: "And there is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum of money sufficient to pay said warrant."

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.

Chapter 144.

Published June 3d, 1858.

AN ACT to authorize the Governor to annul Patents in certain cases.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever the Governor of this State is satisfied that he has erroneously or improperly signed any patent for school or university lands or for swamp lands, and that wrong or injustice may be done or may have been done in consequence of the issuing of such patent, he shall be and hereby is authorized and empowered, upon the request of a majority of the commissioners of school and university lands, to revoke and annul the same. Governor may revoke and annul patents.

SEC. 2. Such patent may be revoked and annulled by the certificate of the Governor that such patent has been erroneously or improperly executed and issued. How revoked and annulled.

SEC. 3. The certificate mentioned in section two of this act shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State, and a certified copy thereof recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of the county in which the patented land lies, and whenever the same is so recorded the said patent shall be absolutely revoked and annulled, and shall be held to be void and of no effect in all courts and places. Certificate to be filed and recorded.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
