

the circuit court in and for the county in which such lands or tenements are situated.

Clerk to keep a book to make entries of judgments—fees.

SEC. 2. The clerk of the circuit court for each county in this State, shall furnish a book, or books, and make an entry of all such judgments filed as aforesaid, and shall be entitled to the same fees as is now provided by law for filing and docketing transcripts of judgments in other courts in this State.

SEC. 3. This law shall be published immediately after its passage by the State printer, and then take effect and be in force.

AN ACT to amend Chapter fifty-two of the Session Laws of 1857, entitled "An Act to authorize the collection of Agricultural, Mineral, and Manufacturing Statistics."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Supervisors to audit accounts of clerks of boards.

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the Board of Supervisors of the several counties, to audit the accounts of the clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the several counties of this State, for the services required of them by chapter fifty-two of the session laws of 1857.

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to authorize the Secretary of State to audit certain accounts for international exchanges, and to provide for the disposal of the same.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Secretary of State to audit account for in-

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized to audit the account of Irving and Willey, of New

York, to the amount of thirty nine dollars and fifty-nine cents for charges and commission upon five cases of international exchanges sent this State by Alexander Vattermare, of Paris; and also to audit the account for the transportation of the same from New York, whenever it shall be presented; and there is hereby appropriated out of the State treasury a sum sufficient to meet the amount so audited and ordered to be paid by the Secretary of State.

SEC. 2. The Governor of this State is hereby authorized, on the arrival of the said books, to make selections of such of them as ought properly to be placed in the State library, and deposit them therein, and to place the remainder of said books, for safe keeping, in the library of the State Historical Society.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

AN ACT for the formation and protection of County Agricultural Societies.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. In all cases when the citizens of a county, or of two counties jointly, shall or may have organized a County Agricultural Society not exceeding one in each county, by the adoption of a constitution and the choice of the ordinary officers, they shall have all the power of a corporation and body politic, and may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, prosecute and defend, to final judgment and execution in any court of law or equity, and may purchase and hold any real and personal estate which shall be necessary to best promote the objects of such association, and which estate shall be exclusively devoted to such objects. Said societies shall also have power to sell and convey any and all such real estate, said conveyance being executed by the President and Secretary of such society. All such land
