

**Chapter 95.***Published May 20th, 1858.*

AN ACT to amend Chapter 28, of the General Laws of 1853, entitled an act for the prevention [preservation] of game.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. No person shall take by any device, contrivance or means whatsoever, any brook-trout, within any of the streams or waters within this State, between the first day of November and the first day of March following in each year; and no person shall at any time take brook-trout with any net, seine, wire basket, spear, grapple, trap, or any device whatever, except hook and line; and every person offending against the provisions of this section, or who shall expose for sale, or shall have any brook-trout in his possession or custody which shall have been taken during the time when the taking thereof is prohibited by this act, shall be liable to the penalties prescribed by the act of which this is amendatory, and subject to prosecution in the manner therein provided.

**Chapter 96.***Published May 20th, 1858.*

AN ACT in relation to Lecturers on Scientific and Literary Subjects and Concerts of Music.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. No law of this State requiring a license for public shows and exhibitions, where admission is gained upon the payment of money, shall be construed to require license from any city, village or town authority for lectures on scientific, moral or literary
