CHAPTER 115.

AN ACT to prohibit the selling of intoxicating drinks on Sunday, and certain other days therein mentioned.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Prohibition. SECTION 1. If any tavern keeper or other person shall sell, give away, or barter, any intoxicating liquors on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, or on the day and at the place of the annual town meeting, or the annual fall election, such tavern keeper or other person so offending, shall be fined for each of such offences in a sum not exceeding five dollars; to be collected before any justice of the peace of the proper county.

This act shall take effect and be in force from SEC. 2. and after its passage and publication.

AN ACT to provide for copying the records in case of division of towns.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. In case of the division of any town and the Records, how obtained. organization of a new town, as soon as the said new town shall have had their first town election after the said division and organization, it shall be lawful for the clerk of said new town, as soon as he shall be duly qualified, to obtain the records properly belonging and pertaining to said new town by copying the same from the records of the old town, and the clerk of the old town is hereby required and ordered to permit such clerk of any new town to have access to the books and records for the purpose aforesaid. SEC. 2. It shall also be the duty of the clerk of the town from which any new town is taken, as described in the first section of this act, to deliver over to the clerk of any such new town, all papers filed in his office belonging or pertaining to such new town, or the inhabitants thereof, and when the records shall have been copied as in the first section of this act provided, and the papers

duly delivered as in this section provided, the same shall be recorded and filed by such clerk of the new town, and when so filed and recorded, shall have the same validity and effect as if originally recorded and filed in the office of such new town.

CHAPTER 117.

AN ACT to amend chapter 13, of the revised statutes, entitled " of counties and county officers."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 35, of chapter 13, of the revised Amendment. statutes is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows: They shall at their first meeting after their election, choose one of their number as chairman, who shall hold this office until his successor is elected, and who shall preside at all meetings, if present; but in case of his absence from any meeting, the members present shall choose one of their number as temporary chairman.

CHAPTER 118.

AN ACT to amend chapter 13, of the revised statutes, entitled "Of counties and county officers."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 79, of chapter 13, of the revised Amendment. statutes, is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows: No person acting as a clerk of any circuit or county court in this state, shall be allowed to practice as attorney or solicitor in the court in which he is acting as clerk, nor shall he be eligible to the office of justice of the peace during the time he holds the office of such clerk.
