

that if in any county the advertisement of any one kind of land shall not exceed fifteen descriptions, the fees allowed for the publication of such advertisement shall be the same as provided by law for the publication of legal notices.

CHAPTER 179.

AN ACT to provide for indexing and transcribing the journals of the Senate and Assembly.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Hiram Bowen, chief clerk of the senate, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars; and to Louis H. D. Crane, chief clerk of the assembly, the sum of two hundred dollars, in full for indexing and completing the transcribing of the journals of the present session of the legislature: *Provided*, that this appropriation shall not be drawn from the treasury until the work is completed, and certified to by the secretary of state.

Take effect. SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 180.

AN ACT to authorize the secretary of state to audit certain accounts.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

**Account to be audited.
For safe.** SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized to audit the account for the purchase of a safe to keep the bank note plates, and records of the bank department of this state, at its agency in the city of New York.
