

SEC. 2. The commissioners of school and university lands are authorized and required to call for and collect upon all mortgages due on or before the first day of January, 1860, upon loans from the university fund, thirty per cent. of the principal of all said loans, which said money shall be paid into the state treasury on or before the first day of February, 1860. Money to be collected.

SEC. 4. The sum of twenty thousand dollars is hereby appropriated from the principal of the university fund to the repayment of said loan from the general fund in the first section mentioned, the same to be paid to said fund from the receipts of said mortgages, and from all sales of lands belonging to said university fund that may hereafter be made, until the whole of said loan, as well as interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent., is fully paid and discharged; said funds to be retained by the treasurer as they may be from time to time received. Appropriation for what purpose.

SEC. 5. The commissioners of school and university lands are authorized hereby to offer for sale all tracts of university lands yet unsold, in the manner and form prescribed by law, during the ensuing season, and the proceeds thereof shall be paid into the state treasury as soon as any such sales are made. Sale of university lands.

## CHAPTER 208.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the clerk of the committee on state affairs.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated from money in state treasury a sum sufficient to pay the clerk of the committee on state affairs of the assembly. Appropriation

SEC. 2. The secretary of state is hereby authorized to audit the account of the said clerk, at a rate not exceeding three dollars per day, upon the certificate of the chairman of said committee, who shall certify to the number of days such clerk has been employed. Per diem.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage. Take effect.
